#### **POLIO VACCINES**

#### Part 4 of 4

By 1959, Jonas Salk's vaccine had reached 90 countries, according to the Singapore Medical Journal. By 1980, the U.S. had eliminated domestic transmission of the disease. After polio, Salk continued working on viruses, including the search for a vaccine for HIV/AIDS.

He and his wife, Donna Lindsay, raised three sons--- Peter, Darrell and Jonathan, all of whom became doctors. While they were growing up, the family spent several summers at Deep Creek Lake in Maryland, two hours from Salk's Pittsburgh lab. The boys enjoyed water skiing.

The Salk Institute of Biological Studies opened in 1963. Salk did not want the facility to bear his name, "[But Basil] O'Connor [President of the Polio Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, now known as the March of Dimes] agreed to aid with construction costs only if the institute were named after Salk..." Without Salk's name, O'Connor knew he could not raise the money. Salk relented and, as reported by (thenewatlantis.com), agreed reluctantly to the use of his name.

Today, the Salk Institute, located in La Jolla, California, is a highly regarded non-profit medical and scientific research organization with 1,137 employees and annual revenue of \$128 million. Its internationally renowned and award-winning scientists explore the foundations of life, seeking new understandings in neuroscience, genetics, immunology, plant biology and other fields.

In 1968, Salk divorced his wife and, in 1970, married Francoise Gilot, an artist, who had been Pablo Picasso's mistress for 11 years. At Gilot's request, Salk agreed that they would stay together for six months each year and stay apart for the rest of each year. Picasso died in 1973, at age 92.

In addition to his Institute, Salk received many honors and awards: a Congressional gold medal; a citation from President Eisenhower; and the Presidential Medal of Freedom from President Carter. Dozens of states named streets and schools after him.

To honor his birthday, October 24 is named "World Polio Day," initiated by Rotary International.

Albert Sabin had similar honors and awards, including the Presidential Medal of Freedom from President Reagan. In 1951, the National Academy of Science accepted him as a member. Salk never

attained membership in that organization. In 2006, the U.S. Postal Service issued postage stamps in honor of Salk and Sabin as part of the distinguished Americans series (Salk, 67 cents; Sabin, 87 cents).

Sabin's Vaccine Institute in Washington, DC, is much smaller than Salk's, with only 100 employees. Founded two years before his death, its purpose is to spread immunization across the world, making vaccines more accessible in small countries. At age 86, Sabin died of heart failure in March 1993 in Washington, DC. A lieutenant colonel in the US Army, he now rests near Dr. Walter Reed in Arlington National Cemetery.

As noted in Sabin's obituary in the New York Times, Salk attributed Sabin's derogatory remarks about him to professional jealousy. "Albert Sabin was out for me from the very beginning,' he said. 'I remember in Copenhagen in 1960, he said to me, just like that, that he was out to kill the killed vaccine.' But Dr. Salk issued a statement yesterday praising Dr. Sabin's enduring contributions to the control of polio."

Salk also died of heart failure two years later at age 80 and is buried in La Jolla, California. It is unfortunate that two scientists with so much in common--- their ancestry, their religion their education, and their profession--- could not share the glory of their accomplishments in a friendly way.

#### **PASSOVER IS COMING!**



I'm certain that virtually everyone reading this column is well aware that Erev Pesach this year falls on Wednesday night, April 5. I'm also certain that everyone is aware of the cleaning, the purchasing of special

foods, the cooking and, of course, the clean-up that are about to happen. It is also time to bring out the Haggadot (plural of Haggadah) which probably have sat in a drawer since last Pesach. As a cantor, I look forward to the beautiful songs of the seder. I learned many Seder songs in Hebrew school decades ago, and they are still a part of the sedarim I lead. But, starting in 2012, I began learning Pesach songs in another language – YIDDISH.

I had told myself for years that I needed to learn Yiddish well enough to be able to read it properly and not rely on someone else's transliterations. I realized in 2012 that if I didn't do it then, I probably never would. So, I talked to Marcia Levinsohn, a long-time JRLW member who was teaching a Yiddish class on Thursdays at Congregation Har Tzeon-Agudath Achim. She invited me to come, and I had my first Yiddish lesson in early 2012. I found that reading Yiddish is very similar to reading Hebrew, and I picked it up very quickly. So, part of my lessons, in addition to learning vocabulary and grammar, was to learn Yiddish songs. One of the songs I learned for Pesach, one I include in my sedarim, is called SHVIMT DOS KESTL AFN TAYKH (The Basket Floats on the River). Its chorus is:

SHVIMT DOS KESTL AFN TAYKH, AFN GROYSN NIL. SHVIMT DOS KESTL RUIK, GLAYKH. SHVIMT DOS KESTL SHTIL.

It translates loosely into English as: "The basket is floating on the river, on the great river Nile. The basket is floating peacefully, steadily, silently."

You all, of course, know who was in the basket.

There are a number of lovely versions available on the internet. My favorite is the one titled AFN NIL and is performed live in concert by the Jewish People's Philharmonic Chorus. If you would like to view the video, type into your browser "Afn Nil youtube" and it should be the first video. It has both the transliterated Yiddish and the translation of all the verses. Definitely worth a look. And maybe, just maybe, you could learn the song and use it at your sedarim.

Wishing everyone a Chag Sameach. Be well. Stay safe.

#### PASSOVER – A HOLIDAY FILED WITH "TRADITION"!

Let me open with this: I LOVE PASS-OVER! Everything about this holiday is special to me - from my youngest memory to today! There is just something about Pesach. This is the holiday where

family traditions reign! I cannot think of a time when preparing for the seder and the family traditions associated with it do not become an invigorating hours-long discussion about sharing each of our best memories!

While the preparation seems to be a lot of work (and the clean up AFTER the seders), somehow, I cannot wait to "dig in!" Not only do I remember my seders from the youngest age; I remember my mother sharing her memories about her seders from her youth! One memory she shared was when she was about 4 years old (that would be 1933!) and her mother (my grandmother whom I called "Gonnie") always made a special effort to make a beautiful presentation of the main course (which was whatever they could afford at the time). Everyone was at the table waiting for Gonnie to bring it out. She "pushed" the door open with her elbow - and this particular holiday it was a turkey (??!!), garnished to a point it could have been in Gourmet Magazine! Gonnie tripped slightly and the beautifully decorated bird/ platter fell on the floor!! According to my mother, no one said a word. No one dared breathe as they watched Gonnie put the turkey back on the platter, "re-decorate/garnish" it, and then place it on the table. (Was there a 10-second rule back then??!!) And the evening moved forward from there!

Now, our family traditions include the part of the seder when my youngest son, Matthew, must get on the floor and pretend to be Pharaoh while my oldest (4-year-old) granddaughter, Aubrey, acts out the song, "One Morning When Pharoah Woke in His Bed," and as the song requires, she must be a frog jumping all over her father. "Frogs here, frogs there, frogs were jumping everywhere!" Meanwhile, my oldest son insists that we sing EVERY verse of Adir Hu, Chad Gadya, etc., just as we did with his grandfather when he was alive. Even 26years after my father's passing, Daniel insists we sing every verse.

And THIS is why I love Passover, because as Tevye states in Fiddler on the Roof, "Because of our traditions, everyone knows who s/he is and what G-d expects us to do. And without our traditions, our lives would be as shaky as a Fiddler on the Roof."

Wishing all my dear JRLW friends a very happy and fulfilling Pesach.

#### Shalom Friends,

At our collective ages, we have many memories some give us more pleasure when considering than others. When I think about Pesach, Passover, so many memories flood the brain. As a former Hebrew teacher at the Hebrew Academy of Tidewater in southern Virginia, I remember preparing bulletin boards this time of the year (although they were constant). I could leave up the letter "Pay" from Purim to begin the word Pesach on my bulletin board. The symbolisms and activities for Pesach seem to highlight the year in many ways. Pesach, which this year begins with the first seder on Wednesday, April 5, is also known as the Holiday of Spring. Pesach is one of the 3 pilgrimage holidays (the others being Sukkot and Shavuot) and one of the most sacred holidays filled with symbolism.

But mostly Passover is celebrated as a time where we recognize the emancipation from being slaves in Egypt to being free Jews heading to Israel. The seder is possibly the most revered Jewish celebration of our religion with many days (in some homes weeks) of preparing our homes, getting rid of all hametz. The Hebrew term of "making Pesach" refers to whole home cleansing and refreshing.

On the seder plate we have the ritualistic shank bone to represent the Paschal lamb (zroa), the horseradish (maror) to represent the bitterness of slavery, the charoset to represent the mortar our ancestors used to build the structures, lettuce to represent spring, the egg (beitzah) to represent the wholeness of life and its continuity, the parsley (karpas) dipped into salt water to remember the tears and on our family's plate, of course the orange to represent equality for women and social justice for all.

We are asked to welcome others to our homes for Passover, and as such, I ask you to consider adding one or 2 extras to your table this year. Do you need someplace to go for seder or do you have room at your table for others? Let me know and I'll try to make a *"shidduch"* (match) as needed. Contact me at <u>Ellynsu@verizon.net</u>.

In occupied Paris, 1941, all Jews are instructed to come forward and identify themselves to the authorities. Jeweler Joseph Haffmann arranges for his family to flee, but his own attempts to escape are thwarted and he is forced to seek his assistant's protection. It's a risky proposition for both men and one that will forever change the fate of all involved.
