share a few of his thoughts on Yom Kippur. The full commentary can be found on his web site.

"To those who fully open themselves to it, Yom Kippur is a life-transforming experience. It tells us that G-d, who created the universe in love and forgiveness, reaches out to us in love and forgiveness, asking us to love and forgive others. G-d never asked us not to make mistakes. All He asks is that we acknowledge our mistakes, learn from them, grow through them, and make amends where we can."

"...to be a Jew is to have the courage to live in a way that is not the way of everyone. Each time we eat, drink, pray or go to work, we are conscious of the demands our faith makes on us...."

"Few religions have asked more of their followers. There are 613 commandments in the Torah. Jewish law applies to every aspect of our being, from the highest aspirations to the most prosaic...."

"Not every civilization is as forgiving as Judaism. There were religions that never forgave Jews for refusing to convert. Many of the greatest European intellectuals— never quite forgave Jews for staying Jews, different, countercultural, iconoclastic. Yet despite the tragedies of more than twenty centuries, Jews and Judaism still flourish, refusing to grant victory to cultures of contempt or the angel of death."

"More than Yom Kippur expresses our faith in G-d, it is the expression of G-d's faith in us."

The High Holy days will be here before we know it, a unique time for introspection. Without being too didactic, have you offended someone and lost a friend or relationship? Is it time to pick up the phone or send an email just to say hello and begin to renew that friendship?

1917 - Part 1 of 2

During World War I, Russia could not feed its civilian population and an army of 15 million at the same time. Thus, on March 8, 1917, 90,000 people filled the streets of Petrograd (St. Petersburg), Russia's capital then, to demonstrate against food shortages, according to History.com. Riots broke out, forcing the government to resign, and the Duma (legislature), supported by the army, to call for the emperor to abdicate, as reported by various sources, including Encyclopedia Britannica. On March 15, Emperor Nicholas II abdicated, ending 304 years of Romanov rule, leading to establishment of a provisional government, an event known as the February Revolution.

Between March 21 and April 3, the provisional government removed all "discrimination based upon ethnic religious or social grounds," including official abolition of the Pale of Settlement, which had been established by decrees during the reign of Catherine the Great (1762-1796). These decrees required Jews to live within a prescribed area from the Baltic Sea to the Black Sea, virtually all land acquired from partition of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth, a vast area (roughly 386,000 square miles or 1 million square kilometers), double the size of today's France. Russian law prohibited Jews from living in large cities and encouraged them to live in "shtetls" (small villages). The 1897 Russian census indicated that most of the Jewish population in the empire remained confined to the Pale. Almost 5,000,000 Jews lived within its boundaries (comprising 11.6% of the total population of the area) while roughly 200,000 lived elsewhere in European Russia. Nearly all of the inhabitants (99%) spoke Yiddish.

Within its boundaries, the Pale of Settlement included part of present-day Poland, and much of what is now Lithuania, Belarus and Ukraine. At the time, Russia had more Jewish population than any other European country.

Official abolition of the Pale of Settlement in 1917 removed a century of restrictions on Jews' geographical mobility, allowing them to move to major cities and to other countries to take advantage of economic and educational opportunities, as reported by the Jewish Virtual Library and other sources.

In Part 2 of this article, the United States enters the

war and Russia has another revolution--- all in 1917, a momentous year in world history.

CANTOR'S CORNER

As I mentioned in the July column, in the 1970 movie, THE ANGEL LEVINE, Harry Belafonte plays black angel-wannabe Alexander Levine. IMDb describes Levine as "a black Jewish street hustler from

somewhere between Harlem and Heaven." And in the advertising for the film, it was said of Levine, "if he's an angel, imagine what God is like."

Belafonte is very effective as Levine, and his interactions with Zero Mostel's Mishkin make this film memorable. Mishkin, an observant Jew, had prayed to God for help and soon finds Levine in his kitchen with no idea of how Levine got there. Levine explains that he was "transmitted" and he's the angel God sent to help Fanny. Levine also explains that he is on probation and needs Mishkin to believe he's an angel. Only then can he produce a miracle to earn his wings, and he must do this within 24 hours. Mishkin responds, "he's a meshuganer" and explains to Levine that Levine doesn't fit his image of an angel. First, Levine is black and second, he doesn't have wings. Try as Levine does to make Mishkin believe. Mishkin remains obstinate and insists that Levine is a fraud.

Fanny, Mishkin's wife, is very ill, but during the time that Levine is in the apartment, she gets out of bed and goes into the kitchen to make a meal for Mishkin and Levine. Mishkin sloughs it off as Fanny forcing herself out of bed to make a meal for them, but to the viewer, it is obvious that Fanny is doing much better and is very comfortable putting out the food. Finally, when Mishkin isn't looking, Levine disappears but leaves his hat. At that point, Fanny takes a turn for the worse, and Mishkin, realizing too late that maybe Levine IS an angel after all, goes to Harlem with Levine's hat. Mishkin walks around asking residents if they know the man to whom the hat belongs. No one does. At the very end of the film. Mishkin finds himself in a vacant lot, and a feather floats above his head. Mishkin tries desperately to grab it, but it eludes him. Levine is gone and will not be coming back. The feather symbolizes a message to Mishkin and everyone watching the film.

One part of the film that I particularly enjoyed came when Levine first appears in the apartment. He is wearing a hat which he takes off fairly quickly. When Mishkin asks him how long he'd been a Jew, Levine replies "all my life." Mishkin challenges him to recite the Hebrew blessing over bread. Levine smiles, goes for his hat, puts it on and says "Baruch Atta Adoshem, Elohenu Melech Ha-olam, ha-moat-see lechem min ha-aretz." Levine's head was covered before he recited the b'rachah! Mishkin replies "you have a very good accent." Actually, the accent isn't all that good, but because Belafonte has brought the Hebrew language to so many people through his songs, I'll give him a pass.

So, what about Jews and miracles? I believe I have an appropriate topic for my September column.

MY BAT MITZVAH EXPERIENCE

Many years ago, I had my Bat Mitzvah in B'nai Israel Synagogue in Washington, D.C. It was on Shabbat Chanukah, November 30, 1956. Girls and women were not allowed on the Bimah on Shabbat morning, so my Bat Mitzvah was on Friday night with my classmate, Phyllis Rabinowitz. Rabbi Segal called us in for a meeting to see how we wanted to divvy up the service. Phyllis responded, "That's easy, Janet can't sing." The Rabbi looked at me for a response and I told him, "She's right!" So, I got the English Chanukah Declamation to talk about the story of Chanukah and I did it very graphically! Phyllis chanted the Haftorah Miketz Chanukah. She led the congregation in Hebrew Psalms and songs, and I led the congregation in English responsive readings. At the Oneg Shabbat, Rabbi Segal came to tell me what a beautiful job I did. I confided to him that I skipped a paragraph and realized my mistake and went back to the important lines and repeated the next line to get back to make sense of the story. He told me that was a good thing to do and was very proud of me and my delivery.

Many years later, I was married and had two daughters. It became time for our eldest daughter, Eileen, to have her Bat Mitzvah. We met with Rabbi Abrams (may he rest in peace) at Beth Torah Synagogue in Hyattsville, Maryland, to discuss the plan. First, we needed a date, so I suggested Friday night dates. The Rabbi asked me why only Fridays. I said, "Because she is a GIRL!" He told us that nowhere is it written that a girl cannot be on the Bimah on Shabbat morning and Eileen said "Yeah, Mom, I want mine on Saturday!" So, in August, 1977, she had her Bat Mitzvah and did a terrific job. Three years later, my second daughter, Charlotte, had her Bat Mitzvah at the same synagogue. I expressed to Rabbi and Mrs. Abrams that I was beginning to feel cheated out of my duty to chant the haftorah at my Bat Mitzvah, That Rosh Hashanah Mrs. Abrams came to me during the service and took me to the Junior Congregation service. I was called to the Torah for an aliyah and I was honored to do so. Afterwards as we walked back to the main Sanctuary, she said,

"Did lightning strike you?" I knew what she meant, and I did occasionally have an aliyah on Shabbat. Rabbi Abrams introduced me to Andy Sandberg who taught me my Haftorah. I had my Adult Bat Mitzvah and chanted the Torah portion from in the Chumash while someone pointed to it in the Torah scroll.

Still later, my husband, Sid, and I moved here to Leisure World. We soon discovered Jewish Residents of Leisure World. I went to a Conservative Shabbat morning service with one of my neighbors. She introduced me to Cantor Mike Kravitz. We got to talking about women who can read Torah. My friend, Miriam Gilbert, told him that I can read Torah. He asked me about it. I had to tell him I had never read from the Torah but read the Haftorah from the Chumash. "UH UH," he said, "At JRLW we chant from the Torah. Would you like to learn?" He gave me a tape recording and I studied the melody and memorized it. Eventually, I learned the Torah SCRIPT and now I can chant from the Torah. I have been given many opportunities to chant aliyot from the Torah. Cantor Kravitz gave me the honor to chant my Haftorah this past June 6.

Thank you, Cantor Kravitz, for all your help, and I thank the many mentors who have helped me over the years.

JRLW PRESENTS PILOT PROGRAM ON WISE AGING

JRLW is offering a pilot program about wise aging taught by De Fischler Herman. De is a certified Rabbinic Pastor and Spiritual Director and is a certified Sage-ing Mentor. She is an active elder, climate activist, avid bicyclist, vegetable gardener, published author, and calligraphic artist.

A version of this program has been taught in many synagogues across the country and JRLW is offering a single introductory session at Leisure World to see if there is any interest in offering a more in-depth version of the program – possibly 3-4 sessions. De recently taught this program at Temple Emanuel in Kensington, Maryland.

Society has not prepared us well for navigating the terrain of aging. It is time to reverse this unhealthy trend, find new ways to address our fears, reframe our perspective regarding the natural processes we are experiencing, and allow us to value ourselves as elders as we harvest our life's work and pass on our legacy to the next generation.

In a highly interactive session, De introduces participants to the groundbreaking work of Rabbi Zalman Schachter-Shalomi (From Age-ing to-Sage-ing) and Rabbi Rachel Cowan & Linda Thal (Wise Aging).



EASY RAVIOLI BAKE

1 jar (25 oz) pasta sauce (any variety)



2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese (8 oz)

2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Heat oven to 350°. Spray bottom and sides of rectangular 13x9-inch baking dish with cooking spray.

Spread ¾ cup of pasta sauce in baking dish. Arrange half of the frozen ravioli in single layer over sauce; top with half of the remaining sauce and 1 cup of the mozzarella cheese. Repeat layers once, starting with the ravioli. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.

Cover with foil, bake for 40 minutes. Remove foil, bake 25 to 20 minute or until bubbly and hot in the center. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.
