POLIO VACCINES

Part 3 of 4

Cooperation on health and science between the United States and the Soviet Union took place during the height of the Cold War. In early 1956, the U.S. State Department allowed Soviet immunologists to visit Salk's lab in Pittsburgh and Sabin's lab in Cincinnati to see and discuss progress made in developing a polio vaccine.

"This cooperation had the blessing of both the FBI and the State Department, despite warnings from the Department of Defense that the materials and research involved could be used in making biological weapons," according to the National Library of Medicine (NLM). The United States did not always grant scientists' requests for foreign travel. As NLM reported, "600 passport applications were rejected on political grounds in the 1950s up until 1958... Sabin's relative freedom in travelling, therefore, was not entirely typical of his time."

Sabin visited the Soviet Union in June 1956. He needed a field test of his vaccine outside the U.S., partly because the U.S. conducted extensive tests for Salk's vaccine, before its approval in 1955. A subsequent manufacturing mishap at Cutter Laboratories had caused numerous deaths of American children.

Sabin found that he worked well with the Russian scientists (particularly Mikhail Chumakov and Anatoly Alexandrovich Smorodintsev). By the end of 1959, the Soviets had administered tests by medicine drops or wrapped candy to 15 million people. By July 1960, the USSR vaccinated 77 million people (ages 2 months to 20 years), according to the British Medical Journal.

In 1961, the United States approved Sabin's weakened (attenuated) live vaccine, which then replaced the Salk vaccine. Sabin contended that the oral vaccine was easier and cheaper to administer and was longer lasting than Salk's injected vaccine. Other Communist countries adopted and administered the vaccine. Cuba inoculated the entire population of children in one day to avoid refrigeration problems.

Sabin continued to work internationally on eradication of polio, largely in the Western Hemisphere with the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) and particularly with Brazil. He served as President of the Weizmann Institute in Israel from 1970 to 1972, one of the world's leading multidisciplinary basic research institutions in science, located in Rehovot, Israel, south of Tel Aviv. Sabin stepped down before the end of his 5-year term because he needed open-heart surgery.

In 1983, he was working on a spray vaccine for measles and experienced paralysis---ironic for a scientist who developed a polio vaccine to prevent pain and paralysis. It was a case of polyneuritis, which gave him great pain and made him unable to walk for about two years.

Sabin, who became a naturalized US citizen in 1930, married his first wife, Sylvia, in 1935. They had two daughters. After Sylvia died in 1966, he married Jane Warner in 1967, divorced her in 1971, and at age 66, in 1972, he married Brazilian-born Heloisa Dunshee de Abranches, who gave him solid support in his work and helped to found the Sabin Vaccine Institute in Washington, DC in 1991.

PURIM IS COMING!

If you've looked at your Jewish calendar, you know that the Fast of Esther and the reading of the Megillah will take place on March 6. Purim is one of our most joyous holidays, and there are lots of songs for Purim that are worth knowing. Three of my favorites, one in Hebrew, one in Yiddish and one in English, are CHAG PURIM, HOP MEINE HAMENTASCHEN and A WICKED, WICKED MAN. If you would like to refresh your memories of these songs so that you can sing them with your grandchildren/great-grandchildren, there are some wonderful versions readily available to you on the Internet. For those whose Yiddish is challenged, there is a wonderful version by Joanie Calem of HOP MEINE HAMENTASCHEN that is sung mostly in English and has a commentary in English that makes the story line easy to understand.

But there is a fourth song, in Hebrew, that I learned in Hebrew school decades ago. I thought of it earlier this year, and I didn't remember that it was a song for Purim. It is, but its message goes far beyond the boundaries of Purim. It is really a song about survival and dealing with enemies who have sought to destroy us. The song is called UTSU EITZAH V'TUFAR. It's a Chassidic song with very few words and a very catchy melody. You can find some nice versions of this song on the Internet as well. UTSU EITZAH V'TUFAR. DABRU DAVAR V'LO YAKUM, KI IMANU EIL. The words loosely translate to "They have devised schemes, but they have been foiled; they have made declarations (against us), but they will not be fulfilled because God is with us."

The words were certainly true centuries ago in Shushan, but the schemes are not limited to ancient times. As I am writing this column, recent news stories in this area have dealt with desecration of synagogues and a Jewish man viciously attacked at a GIANT food store in Gaithersburg. We are no longer dealing with long ago and far away.

We have been reminded regularly in the JRLW MEGILLAH that if any of us sees anything of an anti-Semitic nature, we need to report it immediately. Perhaps this year, that message is more acute than ever. So, CHAG SAMEACH to everyone and let's remember that all of us need to do our part to foil the schemes of those who would try to destroy us.

We are hoping to see all of you – ideally in costume with grogger in hand – ready for the reading of the megillah and our very delightful and entertaining Motown Purim Shpiel!!

As we look forward to Purim, I am proud of how our religion uses both history and analysis(es) that encourages (in this case) how to stand up for ourselves and others to bring forth positive change. It takes courage and "a village" to come to action and value ourselves enough to stand up for your beliefs AND survival. The main characters in Purim are characters that we can compare to many reallife situations to this day – both the "villains" and the heroes – or antagonists/protagonists. BRISKET

Ingredients:

1 3-lb. brisket

1 packet Lipton onion soup mix

1 can vegetarian vegetable soup




Place brisket in pan. Add onion soup mix across top of meat. Add the can of vegetable soup. Add a little water. Cover with aluminum foil. Place in 350° oven. Cook for 1 ½ hour or until tender. Remove from oven and allow to cool. When completely cool, slice the meat. Place back in oven. Spoon the liquid over the brisket. Cover with foil and bake for ½ to 1 hour. Serve warm.






