# FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

What can I say? I prepare my column a few weeks in advance of you reading the Megillah. I had prepared my column to talk about our holiday season and one of rejoicing during Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah. A season of joy for Jews everywhere.

However, yesterday, October 7th, Israel has been attacked by "militants". I heard one Israeli newscaster said that Hamas should not be called "militants". They should be called for what they are "Nazis". Their behavior of killing civilian men, woman and children; humiliating them before murdering them and dragging their bodies through the streets are reminiscent of Kristallnacht and Nazi Germany. Too often the word "Nazi" is bandied about, usually referring to some action taken by our (U.S.) police forces. Today, to our horror, we see true Nazis; going after people because they are Jews.

The following is a paragraph from my draft message written before the attack in Israel. It is still appropriate today. "We will be observing a somber

# FOOD DRIVE NOVEMBER 7-8 AT INTER-FAITH CHAPEL

The Inter-Faith Chapel appreciates the generous donations from the Leisure World community to support our previous food drives. Please consider donating to our Thanksgiving food drive for Manna Food Center, a local food bank serving over 50,000 people each year in Montgomery County. Manna serves all residents who do not meet the county's self-sufficiency standard, defined by the wages needed to meet basic needs without additional assistance. Manna depends upon corporate, faith-based, not for profit, and individual donors in order to meet these needs.

Manna focuses on healthful food donations. Their most needed food list includes instant oatmeal, brown rice, dry and canned beans, whole grain pasta, canned (in water) tuna, salmon or chicken, nut butters, low sodium canned vegetables, canned fruit in juice, fruit cups, shelf stable milk boxes, cooking oil, spices, infant formula and baby food. They do NOT accept soda, cake, candy and cookies. All food needs to be in the original, sealed container.

Drive or walk up to The Chapel at 3680 S. Leisure World Boulevard to drop off your non-perishable food items. Bins will be available outside from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm on Tuesday, November 7 and Wednesday, November 8.

This extraordinary film follows Israeli diplomat, Asher Naim, on a seemingly insurmountable mission to bring 15,000 Ethiopian Jews to Israel. #### **CANTOR'S CORNER 101**

I wanted to use the November column to talk about this year's Conservative High Holy Days services. Even though you are probably reading it at the end of October, I began working on it on September 26, the day after

Yom Kippur.

Preparations began for these High Holy Days services in the spring. The core "team" consisted of Ellyn Kaufman, Harold Geeter, Sid Sussan and me. Outlines for the Rosh Hashanah services went out and Ellyn, throughout the time leading up to the services, did a fabulous job of contacting people about having parts in our services. The overwhelming majority of the people showed up at services to do their parts. Harold, Sid and I met in person over the summer, and we had a plan that worked really well for the Rosh Hashanah services.

And then came Yom Kippur.

In the days just prior to Yom Kippur, I knew my voice was not at 100%. But, with the exception of the year 1965, I had been involved in conducting High Holy Days services somewhere since 1958, starting as one of the cantors for a junior congregation service. And I had always been able to get through Yom Kippur with my voice intact.

Until this year.

At the end of the Kol Nidre evening service, the congregation and I knew that I was in trouble vocally. Harold, Sid and I had the outline for the Yom Kippur morning service, but I hadn't presented one for the afternoon service which I was planning to conduct mostly by myself. So, what to do?

Harold and Sid stepped up big time. I continued to announce pages for the morning and afternoon services with Harold and Sid doing the reading and singing parts. I had some special Yom Kippur stories that both Harold and Sid presented beautifully, and with the last-minute outline I gave the two of them for the Yom Kippur afternoon and Yom Kippur final service, we did get through those final services with dignity and grace.

I saw my ears/nose/throat doctor two days after Yom Kippur ended, and she diagnosed my condition

as acute laryngitis. I couldn't sing and it would be almost two weeks before I could again. That's why I want to provide a shout-out for Harold and Sid. We really couldn't have done it without you.

So, let me wish all of you, once again, a Shanah Tovah u-metukah – a good and sweet new year. Let me also say "thank you" to all of you who have offered prayers and best wishes for my wife, Cheryl, who is battling cancer. The prayers and best wishes are most appreciated during this difficult time. Be well and stay safe.

#### KRISTALLNACHT PROGRAM

On November 9, 2023, JRLW will present a program in the Crystal Ballroom of Clubhouse I, at 2:00 PM, commemorating Kristallnacht, or The Night of Broken Glass which took place on the night of November 9, 1938. It was a pogrom (an anti-Jewish riot) of destruction, beatings, killings, and mass arrests carried out at the direction and participation of the Nazi government. What makes this event important is that it began the violent attempted destruction of the Jews of Europe.

What makes it relevant today is that Kristallnacht serves as a model of what prejudice, racism and hate can become. This is not merely a Jewish problem, but a human rights problem for every minority population. With so many internet sites spuing hatred of Jews, Blacks, Asians, Latinos, Arabs, and LGBT+ and every other minority, the lessons of hatred and what it can and did become, are more relevant today than ever before.

Our guest speaker will be Shelby Gadol, the Assistant Director of ADL's DC region. Among other duties, she manages incident response. She will speak about hate crimes and their rise in the U.S., and what is being done about them.

"ADL fights all forms of antisemitism and bias, using innovation and partnerships to drive impact. A global leader in combating antisemitism, countering extremism, and battling bigotry wherever and whenever it happens. ADL works to protect democracy and ensure a just and inclusive society for all."

# CELEBRATING THE GREAT LEWANDOWSKI!

When Shir Delight meets weekly at their Tuesday evening rehearsals, they wait expectantly for the selections that we

will sing for our next Erev Shabbat service! While I have introduced many new melodies to our prayers and blessings, our wonderful singers are always eager for traditional melodies that can be integrated into our services.

One of the great composers that we celebrate with what is now considered "traditional" synagogue music is Louis Lewandowski (1821-1894). Particularly during the High Holiday services, it is essential to incorporate Lewandowski's melodies.



Louis Lewandowski came from a Polish/German/ Jewish lineage. He composed much of his synagogue music while musical director of the Neue Synagoge in Berlin. He was a child prodigy both in piano and voice and at the early age of twelve he went to Berlin to study at the Berlin Academy. There he perfected his piano skills and his beautiful (at the time!!) soprano voice. Lewandowski was the first Jewish person admitted to the academy at the recommendation of Felix Mendelssohn. When he graduated in 1840, he was appointed the choirmaster of the Berlin Synagogue and composed much of his synagogue music during that time.

In 1866, he was appointed "Royal Musical Director" and then the choirmaster for the Neue Synagoge (what might be termed "Conservative" in today's definition) in Berlin where he composed the entire musical service. At the time, Lewandowski's music was considered quite progressive compared to the ancient Hebrew melodies. He incorporated music for choir, cantor, and organ that were both simplistic and filled with emotion at the same time. Many of his pupils became cantors. His formerly assessed

"progressive" music has now become "traditional" just as our currently characterized "progressive" music is starting to be labeled "traditional!" (Think of Debbie Friedman's *Mi Shebeirach* or Naomi Hirsch's *Oseh Shalom*!)

Lewandowski had a storied and celebrated career, and his music is beloved to this day in all synagogues, regardless of their "denomination!" He died in 1894 and on his (and his wife Helene's) gravestone the inscription reads, "Liebe macht das Lied unsterblich!" (Love makes the melody immortal!). Tragically, his daughter Martha died in Terezin in 1942 at the age of eighty-two.

I hope you can take the time to type in <u>Louis</u> <u>Lewandowski Festival 2019</u> on YouTube so you can hear his truly beautiful music performed by brilliant musicians. No matter where you go to worship around the world, you will hear his melodies and without a doubt, feel moved.

#### THE TREFA BANQUET

To celebrate the ordination of the first graduating class of Hebrew Union College (HUC) in Cincinnati, Jewish community leaders, on July 11, 1883, sponsored an elaborate dinner at a classy, mountain top restaurant. That banquet, attended by 200 people, has become famous because it featured non-kosher (tref) food (shrimp, clams, crabs, and frogs' legs), which offended Jews who observed the dietary rules. Historians regard this event as the first step in splitting the American Jewish community, leading to the creation of Conservative Judaism.

In 2008, Jonathan D. Sarna, a professor at Brandeis University and chief historian of the National Museum of American Jewish History in Philadelphia, wrote an article published by the Jewish Telegraph Agency in 2008, presenting his view of what really happened at the banquet.

It "capped ceremonies aimed, ironically, at unifying American Jews," he wrote. "Earlier in the day, 100 rabbinic and lay leaders, representing 76 congregations from across America, celebrated the 10th anniversary of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations (today known as the Union for Reform Judaism, but then a much broader union of congregations) as well as the ordination of Hebrew Union College's initial class of four rabbis – the first such ordination ever held on American soil."

The menu was not carefully planned by the caterer (Gus Lindeman, a prominent local Jewish businessman), who "took no account that traditionalists were invited." It was the caterer's blunder, Sarna concluded. Rabbi Isaac Wise, an early leader of Reform Judaism in America and founder of HUC, "knew the banquet was a blunder," but defended it. He himself, married to the daughter of an orthodox rabbi, kept a kosher home. Nevertheless, he attacked his critics, asserting that "the dietary laws had lost all validity, and ridiculed them for advocating 'kitchen Judaism'."

In a February 1966 article in Commentary Magazine, historian John J. Appel noted that two rabbis left the banquet without eating anything. Gus Lindeman, he wrote, was caterer for the Allgemeiner Club, whose membership consisted of Cincinnati's wealthiest German Jews, including some who

arranged and paid for the dinner. Professor Sarna's report conflicts with Appel's, which indicates that the manner in which the menu was prepared and presented was not simply the result of an oversight. Appel did conclude, however, that there was no evidence that Rabbi Wise knew about the seafood in advance.

Rabbi Wise abandoned his original goal of unifying American Jews. His detractors called him "The Pope of American Reform Judaism," according to Appel. Rabbi Wise kept defending the banquet. He said that "a large majority of American Jews were indifferent to dietary laws" and that "Orthodox Jewish customs cheapen Judaism before the public."

In 1885, the Reform movement's Pittsburgh Platform, among other things, dismissed the Jewish dietary laws as "entirely foreign to our present mental and spiritual state." Jews who favored a more traditional approach to Jewish life acted to establish New York's Jewish Theological Seminary, which opened on January 2, 1887. It is the primary educational and religious center of Conservative Judaism.

- 1 1/2 cups water
- 1 1/2 cups chicken broth
- 1 stalk celery, sliced
- 1 carrot, sliced
- 1 minced garlic clove Bring to a boil

#### Add:

1/3 cup small pasta (like Orzo)

1 lb. skinless, boneless, chicken thighs cut in ½ inch chunks.

Cover and simmer 10 minutes or until pasta and chicken are done.

Season to taste.

# BOOK AND AUTHOR AND PROGRAM EVENT WITH DEBORAH KALB

Author Deborah Kalb, will appear to discuss her first adult fiction book <u>Off to Join the Circus</u>. Deborah has written three novels for children and nonfiction for adults. She and her father, Marvin Kalb, coauthored <u>Haunting Legacy: Vietnam and the American Presidency from Ford to Obama</u>. She's the host of the blog Book Q&As with Deborah Kalb, where she interviews an eclectic range of authors. Deborah is a former longtime D.C.-based journalist covering Congress and politics.

Off to Join the Circus is the fictional account of what happens to a close-knit (and some would say neurotic) Jewish family of suburban Washington, D.C., when a relative returns after 64 years.

Adele Pinsky ran away as a teenager back in 1954, perhaps to join a circus. The repercussions from her departure reverberated down the generations, affecting her younger brother, Howard, now a 75-year-old retired lawyer; his educator wife, Marilyn; their three daughters; and their two teenaged grandsons. Adele's reappearance in 2018, at a moment when the family is preparing for the younger grandson's bar mitzvah and the birth of the middle daughter's baby, upends the Pinsky family's assumptions about one another in hilarious and poignant ways.

Besides learning to love the family, you will enjoy the references to so many places you will recognize in DC and Montgomery County. The book can be found in your favorite bookstore or online.
