## FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

By the time you read this, several of our joyous holidays will be over and we will be looking forward to Chanukah. A year ago, I opened my column with the following paragraph:

"However, yesterday, October 7th, Israel has been attacked by "militants". I heard one Israeli newscaster said that Hamas should not be called "militants". They should be called for what they are "Nazis". Their behavior of killing civilian men, woman and children; humiliating them before murdering them and dragging their bodies through the streets are reminiscent of Kristallnacht and Nazi Germany. Too often the word "Nazi" is bandied about, usually referring to some action taken by our (U.S.) police forces. Today, to our horror, we see true Nazis; going after people because they are Jews".

It's now over a year later and Israel is still at war, but now on several fronts. American citizens, are using their first amendment right to celebrate, yes celebrate, the murdering of Jews on October 7th. Antisemitism is at an all-time high and we are seeing

images on the news reminiscent of Kristallnacht when Jews were attacked just because they were Jews.

I don't have the answer. Should our government arrest and prosecute the violent offenders? Should people who say they support Hamas, a terrorist group, be arrested and prosecuted as terrorist themselves? Should Jews and their friends meet the pro-Hams rallies head on. Prior to World War II, Jews, often supported by Myer Lansky and his mafia friends, would attend Nazi rallies and beat the Nazi sympathizers. Or, we can do nothing and hope and pray it goes away.

I am not advocating violence. Perhaps doing nothing is the best choice so as not to give the protesters much news coverage. As I said, I don't have the answers and can only hope and pray our government and leaders take the appropriate actions.

Even though Purim is about 6 months away, I thought this paragraph to be apropos The Unique Joy of Purim, article shared online by Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks zt'l, March 2020:

"There are two kinds of joy. There's expressive joy, the joy you experience and communicate because that's how you feel. But there's also therapeutic joy, the joy you will yourself to feel in order to protect yourself against negative emotions. And when we rejoice on Purim, on this festival which is actually the festival about antisemitism, we are

#### **YIDDISH RADIO**

The radio industry grew rapidly in the 1920's. The first commercial radio station in the United States was KDKA in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, which broadcast the Harding-Cox presidential election returns on November 2, 1920.

During that decade, the number of U.S. broadcast stations increased from zero to over 500. Many of the two million Yiddish-speaking immigrants in the U.S. listened with delight to news and programs in their own language. New York alone had 23 Yiddish radio stations.

A major New York Yiddish radio station was WEVD. The Socialist Party of America originally purchased the station in 1927 to honor their recently deceased leader, Eugene V. Debs. Federal regulators rejected the organization's request to name the station WDEBS because call letters were limited to four. Thus, the Party used Debs' initials for their call letters.

In 1932, the socialist-leaning, Yiddish daily newspaper, the Forward, purchased the station, and used the slogan: "We speak your language."

Radio became a consumer craze, and its popularity contributed to a shared national identity. Radio provided a reliable way to receive news, sports, and music, and was an inexpensive form of entertainment for families.

WEVD broadcast a variety of shows, including The Forward Hour, Tsures bay laytn (People's Problems), Der yidisher filosof (The Jewish Philosopher), and Mame-loshn (Mother Tongue).

Yiddish radio on WEVD declined in popularity in the 1950s due to a number of factors, including: the rise of television; increased assimilation in the United States; the Holocaust; and Israel's choice to make Hebrew its official language.

Television replaced radio as the dominant broadcast medium by the 1950s and took over home entertainment. Approximately 8,000 U.S. households had television sets in 1946; 45.7 million had them by 1960.

In 2003, the Forward sold the station to ESPN, changing its call letters to WEPN, officially ending the 76-year history of WEVD in New York City.

Musicologist Henry Sapoznik has donated his extensive collection of recorded Yiddish radio broadcasts to the Library of Congress, making them available to the U.S. public.

#### **CANTOR'S CORNER**

Wishing all of you a Shanah tova u-metukah (a good and sweet new year).

I mentioned in my August column that when I was hired to be the seventh grade Sunday school teacher for

the Bethesda Chevy Chase Jewish Community Group, I was working with a private bar mitzvah pupil, David, who had worked unsuccessfully with 2 other teachers prior to working with me. David was scheduled to have his bar mitzvah at what is now Tikvat Israel Congregation in Rockville on November 30, 1968, 2 days after Thanksgiving. I first met with him at his house in July, 1968, 4 months before his bar mitzvah.

David, the youngest of 5 children, did not have an extensive Hebrew School background. His father was in the military and was stationed in Viet Nam. He would not be coming home until just before David's bar mitzvah. His mother, a convert, had virtually no Hebrew background. When I joined David and his mother in their living room, the first thing I saw was a reel-to-reel tape recorder. I recorded the Torah blessings, haftarah blessings and David's portion of the haftarah and urged the 2 of them to listen.

David started slowly, but, by the end of October, he was making progress. However, he had much to do to be ready for his bar mitzvah.

On Saturday night, November 2, 1968. I started feeling really sick and one of my college roommates drove me to Sibley Hospital where I underwent an emergency appendectomy early Sunday morning. It would be 2 weeks before I saw David again, and I was expecting the worst. To my surprise, he had made remarkable progress during my recuperation. He had listened to the tape regularly, and his verses were fitting into place. By the time he met with the rabbi during the week before his bar mitzvah, he had mastered the blessings for the Torah and haftarah as well as his haftarah portion. In my final at-home meeting with David, I asked his mother if SHE would like to chant his haftarah. Without a text or notes of any kind, she began chanting the haftarah blessings and the early verses of his

haftarah. She had heard the tape so often that she had memorized the blessings and much of David's haftarah.

I attended David's bar mitzvah, and he did himself and his family proud. Interestingly enough, while I didn't meet David's father until the bar mitzvah, I had known David's paternal GRANDFATHER for years. I knew him only by his first name, Nathan, but he worked at the meat counter at one of the kosher supermarkets which I frequented. What a pleasant surprise to see him at such a simcha where his grandson had done so well.

David was the first of many bar and bat mitzvah students with whom I'd work over the next 33 years. I could have failed as a bar mitzvah teacher, but I thought it was worth taking the risk. There is a lesson here, and it's that sometimes you have to take a risk in order to see what you can do. So, for any of you who have promised yourself that you can do something but put it off because you were afraid of failure, I say "GO FOR IT." Maybe you'll find out that you are more capable than you thought.

I write this column immediately after our Rosh Hashanah services. After reflecting on the lessons learned from the Rabbi's d'rash(es), I am focused on the importance of what brings us together as Jews rather than what

separates us. I think about the important messages of Tikkun Olam and our prayers for peace in the world, including Oseh Shalom.

However you identify religiously, whether as Reconstructionist, Orthodox, Conservative, Humanist or Reform, services all over the world, regardless of denomination, integrate the Amidah, the Kaddish, Aleinu and all the prayers that are so important to our hearts, spirit, and beliefs.

Within our own membership, however, specifically among our Reform and Conservative leaning membership, we seem to have a difficult time praying together and acknowledging the legitimacy of our various denominations.

In a time when we are trying to fight antisemitism all around us and outside groups are seeking to find reasons to hate Jews, we ourselves are finding reasons to judge each other and separate or remove ourselves from our own. It truly hurts my heart.

When I chant prayers or read Torah during an integrated service that incorporates both traditions, I have always thought that there is no "separation" of our intent, yet, it appears I have been truly naïve. We all love tradition, and certainly, from my viewpoint, while melodies that are familiar are especially comforting, like a wonderful brisket or chicken soup, sometimes the "recipes" can change, but the final result remains the same.

As we begin 5785, I yearn for a time that within our own community we can find gratitude in our hearts for the blessing that JRLW provides us – an opportunity to pray together without dissention. I hope that we can appreciate the core of our prayer and welcome each other with the beauty of the message that we are taught as Jews. The diversity of our religion is our strength, whether Ashkenazic or Sephardic, Reform or Conservative. Let us begin this new year with the intention of acceptance and

gratitude.

If we are not there for each other, who will be there for us?

I send all of my beloved community continued best wishes for an accepting, peaceful sweet, and healthy 5785.

#### RECIPE CORNER

#### **CARROT TZIMMES**

#### Ingredients

1 tablespoon canola oil

1 ½ carrots, peeled and cut into ¼ inch rounds1/2 cup golden raisins

1/4 cup orange juice
2 tablespoons honey
2 tablespoons brown sugar
Salt and pepper to taste
2 tablespoons minced parsley

#### **Directions**

Heat oil in a pan over medium-high heat. Add carrots, raisins, orange juice, honey, brown sugar, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer until carrots are tender, about 25 minutes.

Uncover pan, increase to high and cook until sauce has thickened, about 5 minutes. Sprinkle parsley on too before serving.


