FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

Looking forward to celebrating the joys of Purim? A time to recall a young Jewish woman saving the Jews in the Persian Empire. Not to rain on your parade, but we should not forget the times our people were not so fortunate. Purim was marked by tragedy in Minsk, Belarus in 1942, when Nazi forces murdered thousands of Jews in the Minsk Ghetto. The massacre took place on Purim, a Jewish holiday that celebrates the defeat of Haman the Amalekit.

What happened? The following was copied from Google: "On the eve of Purim, the Nazis demanded that the Jewish Council hand over 5,000 Jews for deportation. The Jewish Council refused, and many Jews went into hiding. The Nazis marched thousands of Jews to a ravine and shot them. Children from the ghetto's nursery were buried alive in sand pits. The Gestapo hanged the Jewish Council members in the street." I know it is a downer to recall these events but we should never forget them either. happened a long time ago, like the Civil War or the Korean War, just something written in a history book. I feel it is our duty as Jews, to remind the younger generation that the evils of antisemitism are still around us. The demonstrators who shout, "From the River to the Sea" are calling once again for the extermination of Jews. As we celebrate Purim with festive traditions, costumes, groggers, and hamantaschen, let's take a few minutes to recall the many times in our Jewish history that we were not so fortunate.

This 2008 **Purim** message from Rabbi Sacks was aimed at the community of Sderot, following an intensified wave of terror from Gaza. (Joel's comment: does this sound familiar?)

"Why, in a world in which there are 82 Christian nations and 56 Muslim ones, is it so hard for people to accept the right of the Jewish people to just one nation of its own?

Why, when the connection between Jews and the land of Israel goes back more than 3,000 years, far longer than any other nation in the West, do Jews still have to fight for the right to be, a right denied by Hezbollah and Hamas? Heaven alone knows....

We learn two lessons from the story of Purim. The first is that Mordechai would neither kneel nor bow down. The Jewish people do not bow down to any pressure. Especially the Jewish people in Israel. ... and He will lead us upright to our land. Because of Israel, because of your strength, because of your

refusal to be intimidated, every Jew walks a little taller today.

The fate of Haman has been throughout history the fate of individuals and nations: that those who try to destroy the Jewish people end by destroying themselves. Great empires sought to harm the Jewish people: from Egypt, Babylon, Greece and Rome in ancient times, to the Third Reich Yet every one of them has disappeared, while our tiny, vulnerable people can still say "Am Yisrael Chai", (The people of Israel live.)".

I even depressed myself writing this column and for depressing you, for that I apologize. I know it is dark and we should be in a good frame of mind for Purim. So, when we attend the reading of the Megillah (the actual and not our newsletter) or any other time, make a lot of noise. Let's drown out Haman's name and the names of all the others who seek to destroy the Jewish people.

If you check your Jewish calendar, you will see that the 13th of Adar falls on March 13, 2025. That is the day on which the Fast of Esther is observed, meaning that the festivities of Purim will soon be upon us.

We will listen to the reading of the Megillah (the scroll of the book of Esther), eat hamantaschen and are given permission to drink wine freely (but, hopefully responsibly). There are, of course, wonderful songs for Purim, and I'd like to use this column to introduce you to one you may not know – "Purim Song" by the Maccabeats.

The Maccabeats is a 14-member a cappella group that was formed at Yeshiva University in 2007. If you have been to any of the Chanukah presentations that I have led for JRLW, the Maccabeats are always on the program. The group specializes in parodies of songs, and one of the songs they parody is a song by Pink called "Raise Your Glass." Pink's official video came out in 2010 and is definitely worth watching. It can easily be found on the Internet by typing into your browser "Pink Raise Your Glass YouTube." The video should pop right up.

The Maccabeats' parody came out in 2011, and, it too, can easily be found on the Internet. Just type into your browser "Purim Song" the Maccabeats YouTube" and you'll get it. "Purim Song" tells the story of Purim in a very unique way. Here are the words to the chorus.

"So, raise your glass if you can see the hidden meaning. It's right in front of you. We will never be anything but proud to tell the story. 'V'nahafoch hu (it was turned upside down).' So won't you come on and come on and raise your glass. Just come on and come on and raise your glass."

The "Purim Song" video is quite spirited and includes some absolutely adorable kids. It is a video that I highly recommend that you watch.

The Life and Music of Naomi Shemer

Our presenter will be Cantor Margery Auerbach. Naomi Shemer is most famous for writing the words and music to Yerushalayim shel Zahav (Jerusalem of Gold) which has become the second national anthem of Israel. Cantor Auerbach will speak about her long and varied career as the most celebrated woman Israeli composer of the 20th century and will sing some of her most famous songs. Shemer's compositions reflect the history of Israel, its beauty and culture, and its yearning for peace.

Marge Auerbach is Cantor Emerita of Bet Aviv, a Reform Congregation in Columbia, MD, which she served for 14 years. Her career as a cantor followed 31 years as an educator in Montgomery County as a teacher and elementary school principal. She studied education and music at Smith College and received her M.Ed. and PhD in Education at the University of Maryland.

RECIPE CORNER

HAMENTASCHEN FOR PURIM

- 3 large eggs
- · 1 cup granulated sugar
- ¾ cup vegetable oil
- ½ cup orange juice
- 2 ½ teaspoons vanilla extract
- 5 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- · 1 cup fruit preserves, any flavor

Directions

- Gather the ingredients. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease cookie sheets.
- Combine eggs and sugar in a large bowl; beat with an electric mixer until smooth and creamy.
 Stir in oil, orange juice, and vanilla. Combine flour and baking powder; stir into batter to form a stiff dough, adding more flour if needed.
- Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and roll out into a 1/2-inch thickness. Cut into circles using a cookie cutter or the rim of a drinking glass; place 2 inches apart onto the prepared cookie sheets.
- Spoon about 1 to 2 teaspoons of preserves into center of each cookie. Pinch edges to form three corners.
- Bake in the preheated oven until lightly browned, 12 to 15 minutes. Cool on the cookie sheets for 1 minute; transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

PURIM IN A NUTSHELL

The Persian empire of the 4th century BCE extended over 127 lands, and all the Jews were its subjects. When King Ahasuerus had his wife, Queen Vashti, executed for failing to follow his orders, he orchestrated a beauty pageant to find a new queen. A Jewish girl, Esther, found favor in his eyes and became the new queen—though she refused to divulge the identity of her nationality.

Meanwhile, the anti-Semitic Haman was appointed prime minister of the empire. Mordechai, the leader of the Jews (and Esther's cousin), defied the king's orders and refused to bow to Haman. Haman was incensed and convinced the king to issue a decree ordering the extermination of all the Jews on the 13th of Adar—a date chosen by a lottery Haman made (hence the name Purim, "lots").

Mordechai galvanized all the Jews, convincing them to repent, fast and pray to G-d. Meanwhile, Esther asked the king and Haman to join her for a feast. At the feast, Esther revealed to the king her Jewish identity. Haman was hanged, Mordechai was appointed prime minister in his stead, and a new decree was issued granting the Jews the right to defend themselves against their enemies.

How We Celebrate

On Purim, there are four mitzvahs we observe:

name. Purim is the only time when it's a mitzvah to make noise!

1. Hear the Megillah Head to your synagogue to hear the whole *megillah*. The *megillah*, a.k.a. "The Book of Esther," is the scroll that tells the Purim story. When Haman's name is mentioned you can twirl *graggers* (noisemakers) or stamp your feet to eradicate his evil



2. Give to the Needy One of Purim's primary themes is Jewish unity. Haman tried to kill us all, we were all in danger together, so we celebrate together, too. Hence, on Purim day, we place special emphasis on caring for the less fortunate. Give money or food to needy people. On Purim, we give a to whoever asks; we don't verify his or her bank balance first.



 Send Food Gifts to Friends On Purim, we emphasize the importance of friendship and community by sending gifts of food to friends.



4. Feast! During the course of Purim day, gather your family, maybe invite a guest or two, and celebrate with a festive Purim meal.

Masquerade! On Purim, children—and some adventurous adults, too—traditionally dress in costumes, an allusion to G-d's hand in the Purim miracle, which was disguised by natural events.
