Hopefully, several people will volunteer and will take over even a portion of what she does.

Passover is over and we have the following holy days to look forward to. Shavuot (June 1-3), Rosh Hashanah (September 22-24), Yom Kippur (October 1-2), Sukkot (October 6-13), Shemini Atzeret (October 13-15), Simchat Torah (October 24-25), and Hanukkah (December 25-January 2). Almost all are "joyous" celebrations where we eat and we offer thanks to Hashem.

We also have days which are very solemn. Days when we recall the horrors are people were subjected to, for example: "Two of the days are Yom HaShoah the Jewish Memorial Day for the Holocaust, marked on the 27th of the Hebrew month of Nisan, typically in April. This might sound similar to International Holocaust Remembrance Day which takes place in January, but these are actually two different occasions Yom HaShoah is the Jewish community's day for internal reflection. It's an opportunity to educate children, share stories, honor the victims of the Holocaust, and recognize the accomplishments of survivors." (JRLW will hold a special program on Sunday, May 4th)

"In comparison, International Holocaust Remembrance Day is meant for everyone (no matter their religion or ethnicity) to remember the victims of the Holocaust. The UN General Assembly designated that it would fall on January 27th each year to mark the day that the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration and extermination camp was liberated in 1945."

IS THERE A "REAL" MELODY FOR OUR PRAYERS?

Tevye reminded us of the importance of "Tradition!" Tradition is so important to all of us when we celebrate holidays together and attend our simchas and

build our community at Shabbat and other services. But is there an "approved" melody for our so-called "traditional" Passover, Purim, or Chanukah songs? Even chanting Torah has a variety of melodies that we learn based on who our teachers were! So, is there a "right" way or is it actually the way we heard it when we were children? Or is there a wrong way to chant or sing a beloved tune? Who is the authority to look to for an answer to these questions?

I am going to tell you right now! The authority is your heart! There are a multitude of Adon Olam melodies and today our grandchildren are learning to sing Adon Olam to Hamilton, Wicked, and many popular songs! The meaning of the prayer is always paramount and when a beautiful traditional or modern melody is sung, it enhances the personal experience for each of us. My dear JRLW choir, Shir Delight, has a collection of music that includes multiple versions of L'cha Dodi, Hashkiveinu, V'shamru, Mi Chamocha, Bar'chu, Oseh Shalom, etc. In fact, we have several versions of V'shamru by the same composer! Somehow Debbie Friedman's Mi Shebeirach, written in 1987, has become the "standard" used in so many synagogues and settings. For our children and grandchildren, they will think of this melody as the "real" Mi Shebeirach!

So, we can continue to have lively debate on our own "traditional" melodies of prayers, and they will all be "the correct" melody! One thing that seems undebatable though will be two songs that we most likely sang at our seders this year, Dayenu and Eliyahu Hanavi....although, I am sure that some may say they have a different melody for those songs, too! Please remember that you only need to love music to join Shir Delight, our brilliant choir! Do not worry about your vocal ability, I assure you that you will blend in and most importantly, have a wonderful time and make new friends.

YONAH SCHIMMEL

After more than one hundred years, it is still there on the east side of lower Manhattan---Yonah Schimmel's Knish Bakery. Little has changed since the store opened in 1910 on the ground floor of a five-story tenement. It is the oldest knish bakery in the country, and still operated by members of the founding family.

Yonah Schimmel was born in 1866 in Galicia (then a province of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, now the eastern part is in Ukraine, the western in Poland). In different articles, writers describe Yonah as a "Romanian Rabbi," a "Torah scribe," and a "Torah teacher."

When he arrived in the United States in 1890, he sold knishes from a heated food cart in Coney Island. Twenty years later, he opened the store on the Lower East Side.

"Knish" is a Yiddish word that comes from the Polish word "knysz" or from the Ukrainian word "knysh." Often eaten as an appetizer or snack, it is a small baked or fried crust stuffed with a filling, which can be mashed potatoes, chopped meat, kasha, spinach or sweet potatoes. Even blueberries or other fruit. Newer knishes may even have jalapeno.

The knish has become a cultural symbol and has had some political influence as well. As written by Milton Glaser and Jerome Snyder in New York Magazine in 1968: "No New York politician in the last 50 years has been elected to office without having at least one photograph showing him on the Lower East Side with a knish in his face."

Jewish candidate Robert Morgenthau (son of Henry Morgenthau Jr.) lost the 1962 New York gubernatorial election to Nelson Rockefeller, a Baptist, presumably because he did not pose with a knish as Rockefeller did, according to several writers, including Ted Merwin, in "Pastrami on Rye."

Presently, the store is open seven days a week and anyone can buy knishes from Yonah Schimmel online with free delivery anywhere in the United States.

The story continues with the impact of the horrors of the Holocaust on the children and grandchildren of Holocaust survivors. How were they affected by an event that occurred before their births?

We have read and seen the testimonies of those who survived. We have read the many books and watched countless documentaries. We have learned well the history of state sponsored hate and attempted genocide.

The trauma caused by the horrors of the Holocaust changed every Jew that survived, their children and generations beyond. There have been numerous studies by many investigators concluding that trauma and PTSD is genetically transmitted to subsequent generations, I'dor va dor.



CANTOR'S CORNER

One of my favorite Torah portions is KEDOSHIM, and it will be part of the double portion ACHARAY MOT -KEDOSHIM that we will read at our JRLW service on Saturday, May 10. Portion KEDOSHIM gets its name from some early words in the portion "Kedoshim tiheyu (you shall be holy)." And, further into this portion, there is a 3-word phrase that is one of the most important phrases in all of Torah – "V'ahavta I'rayacha kamocha (and you shall love your neighbor as yourself)." Not only are these words timeless, they are also as relevant today as they were when they were written.

These 3 words are also included in a beautiful Hebrew song called "Amar Rabbi Akiva (Rabbi Akiva said)." Here is the complete text of the lyrics.

"Amar Rabbl Akiva. V'ahavta l'ray-acha kamocha. Zeh k'lal gadol ba-Torah."

These words can be translated as "Rabbi Akiva said 'love your neighbor as yourself.' This is a great principle in the Torah."

You are all familiar with the folk music revival of the 1950s and '60s. Those of you who have seen A COMPLETE UNKNOWN are familiar with Bob Dylan's rise to musical fame. There were many other well-known artists during folk music's heyday, but I'd like to bring to your attention a group you may NOT have known. The group, composed of 7 women, was called "The Pennywhistlers" and was talented enough to be invited to perform onstage with the likes of Bob Dylan, Joan Baez, Pete Seeger, and Leonard Cohen. Theodore Bikel said of them "These women were the closest thing to authenticity in the United States, a tribute to good musicianship and a good ear."

The Pennywhistlers would record an album called SONGS OF THE EARTH with Bikel. I am happy to say I own this album and would describe The Pennywhistlers' work with Bikel as musical magic.

The Pennywhistlers was formed in 1962 by Ethel Raim, a woman from the Bronx who, early in her career, specialized in Yiddish folk songs. Much

of The Pennywhistlers' repertoire was songs from Eastern Europe with an accent on a cappella singing, multiple-part harmonies and accurate pronunciation. Their first album came out in 1963 on Folkways Records, was called "The Pennywhistlers" and included "Amar Rabbi Akiva."

You can find "Amar Rabbi Akiva" on the internet by typing into your browser "Amar Rabbi Akiva by The Pennywhistlers." I've listened to this selection repeatedly and love it every time I hear it. I hope all of you enjoy it as much as I do. The song will be included as part of our service on May 10.

RECIPE CORNER

PEACH DUMP CAKE

4 cups sliced peaches

1/3 cups sugar

1 ½ teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 box white cake mix

34 cup butter, melted

Heat oven to 350 F. Spray bottom of 13 x 9-inch pan with cooking spray. In pan, mix peaches, sugar and cinnamon. Spread evenly. Top with dry cake mix, and gently shake pan to distribute evenly. Pour melted butter over top, tilting pan to cover as much of the top with butter as possible.

Bake 42 to 45 minutes or until light golden brown, mostly dry on top and bubbly around edges. Cool 20 minutes before serving. Top with whipped cream or ice cream, if desired.






