Coming of Age in Maryland: Mid-Year Report

Coming of Age in Maryland (CoA) has been successfully providing an array of services for older adults in Montgomery County for several years. CoA's goal is to help seniors remain socially engaged and to live healthier, safer, independent lives in their homes and communities. CoA helps reduce social isolation through a variety of social programs, social work, home health and transportation services. The program helps empower older adults to live fuller lives.

Did you know?

- CoA engages nearly 1,250 people on our mailing list by responding to their changing needs.

- CoA does much to empower older adults – engaging and recognizing them as valued members of the community - and enabling them to safely age-in-place.

The importance and value of the Coming of Age is clear. I am proud to share the following data from our recent report to State of Maryland for the period of July - December 2011.

822 socialization services were provided to 424 people -- a 65% increase of service from last year
A licensed social worker interacted with more than 300 older adults
The number of home health services double from 101 to 206 from last year
176 individual rides on JCA provided buses brought participants to a cruise along the Potomac, Toby's Dinner Theater, the Hirschhorn Museum, and shows at the Rockville Musical Theater and the Kennedy Center.

CoA in Maryland is reaching a growing number of older adults who live in Gaithersburg, Bethesda, Rockville and Silver Spring. I encourage you to tell your friends and neighbors about CoA and invite them to call me or join our growing mailing list!

### **RECIPE CORNER**



PASSOVER NUT COOKIES 6 eggs 1 cup sugar Grated rind of 1 lemon 3 tbsp. oil 2/3 cup ground nuts 1 cup matzo cake meal 2 tbsp. potato starch Pinch salt

Beat eggs and sugar together until light yellow. Add the rest of the ingredients. Mix well and let the mixture stand for about 10 minutes. Now drop by teaspoon onto oiled or non-stick cookie sheet, or line the cookie sheet with parchment paper sprayed with Passover vegetable spray. Allow room for spreading. Sprinkle with sugar and bake in hot oven (400 degrees) for about 15 to 20 minutes. Cool for 5 minutes before transferring to cooling rack. Store in tightly covered container (hide away from children).

#### THE EVIDENCE IS NOT ALWAYS CIRCUMSTANTIAL

April is upon us, the month for Passover, with all of its rich traditions, and the month wherein a special day is set aside, just for fools! Springtime was always an excuse to behave in a giddy way, to feel nonsensical sometimes, and to go with it. Recently, in one of my more whimsical moods, I was recalling some situations in my life which could have easily been interpreted to be something other than it was!

For instance, there was the time I was rehearsing the role of Ethel, the mother in Barefoot in the Park, and we were rehearsing in Calverton Elementary School. The first scene was in a bare apartment and I was sitting on a suitcase, as the furniture was scheduled for arrival the next day. I supplied my own suitcase, but the director said, "Better not leave it here overnight. Someone might walk off with it." We rehearsed three nights per week, and I was given a ride to the school with the fellow who played the Robert Redford role, only he was a little better looking. I never could make up my mind, and I suppose they thought I just wasn't sure if I wanted to leave my husband or not, so I let them think what they wanted to.

Then there was the time I worked at the White House. When the FBI came to Chapel View Drive to check on my reputation (which was done on a regular basis throughout the year) the neighbors would let me know in their own inimitable way that some government guys were checking me out. The question was always, "What in the world did you do????."

He put on the robe and descended the stairs. While I looked for my poor excuse for a sewing box, in walks my sister Ruthie, with a deer-in-the-headlights look on her face!

Ahh, the things we live through in one lifetime. These stories prove the theory that you really can't always believe what you see, and that timing is everything!

## THE PASSOVER SEDER

My first memory of a Seder was at Grandmother's my table. remember lots of cousins being there also. My Uncle would lead the Seder, reading from a large book. I don't know if it was a Hagaddah. He started from the beginning and read in a dramatic voice. Sometimes he would stop to show us a picture, or to ask questions of us children to make certain we understood the From time to time, the story. proceedings had to be halted as relatives arrived at the house from such far away places as "Philly" or "northwest." Then there were greetings and hugs all around. And kisses from Aunts. Those Seders lasted for hours; some of us got fidgety and had to be excused from the table.

Fast forward to the Seders in my own home. Preparing for the Seder was the one time in the year where my four boys were happy to help. (Continued on the next page) Each year as the special Seder dishes were brought up from the basement and unpacked, there were eight hands reaching into the cartons to unwrap amid happy voices: "Remember this one?" There were no complaints about cleaning their rooms before company came-well, maybe one or two objections. The boys chopped liver, and even helped with the baking. The Hagaddahs we used were not the Maxwell House ones that I remembered as a child, but the Hagaddah put out by Rabbi Z. Harry Gutstein who was our Rabbi at the time.

Our Seders grew as the family grew and as friends were included. These Seders were serious but definitely fun occasions. Everyone around the table took turns reading. There always seemed to be a scuffle about where the Afikomen had been The Four Questions were hidden. read in English and Hebrew by the youngest one at the table—with help from the older children. The singing of Dvanu was always loud and boisterous. There were years when we had as many as 38 people at the table. There were always enough helping hands following the meal to make the work light. I remember those Seders with a lump in my throat.

Now, just as everything else in life, the torch has been passed to the younger generation. L'dor v'dor. I go, as a guest, to my son's Seder. All that is required of me is the chopped liver and my nut sponge cake. The Seders are joyful. They make their own Hagaddahs. They've added playful, but meaningful games to the Seder. And now there is the Cup for Miriam. The dogs have to be kept away from the door when it is opened for Elijah. And the singing! Oh my, the singing! After a delicious meal and Birchat Hamazon, it is time to go home and to relive memories of the Seders as they have been celebrated through the years.

It is my hope that the Passover Seder, with all the little changes, will continue to be enjoyed by all the future generations of my familily.

#### MARK KLEMPNER AND "THE HEART HAS REASONS"




Mark Klempner sought out some of the last surviving Dutch rescuers of Jewish children to better understand how and why they made their courageous choices. Inspired bv their willingness to risk everything to help others during the Nazi occupation of Holland, he became interested in deeply what the rescuers have done with their lives since and where their moral compasses point today.

What emerges is both a window to the past and a vision for the future. If the rescuers could remain committed to making a difference while under the boot of the Nazi regime, we surely have something to learn from them about taking a stand against injustices, about maintaining an open heart and about not giving in or giving up.

Mark Klempner folklorist. is а historian and social commentator. Coming on the heels of Yom Hashoah, this presentation is both timely and critical in understanding the contributions of the Dutch Gentiles whose courage and understanding helped save many lives.
