Leading Area Bluegrass Band, Newgrass Effect Entertains at Leisure World

Newgrass Effect is a progressive, contemporary bluegrass band, featuring seasoned DC-area musicians whose repertoire includes traditional bluegrass sounds and other forms of music. The musicians are noted for their dynamic instruments and melodic, three-part harmonies. Newgrass Effect will entertain in Clubhouse I on Wednesday, April 24 at 1 pm. The band is led by Terry Wittenberg on banjo (Terry's mom Thelma is a resident of Leisure World). Terry has played banjo since 1971. Tom Gray is usually considered the leading bluegrass bassist of his generation. Tom toured nationally and internationally with the Seldom Scene until 1986. He was inducted into the Bluegrass Hall of Honor in 1996. Scott Morgan is a lifelong musician. He has played many types of music with friends and family for over 45 years.

John Relph plays the mandolin and guitar. He plays American old time and Celtic fiddle tunes, Newgrass, classical and Blues and Rock. He has played in Bluegrass bands in Maryland and Virginia since moving to the region in 2002.

COMING OF AGE FILM

We will be screening the film "Orchestra of Exiles" on Monday, April 29, in recognition of Yom Hashoah.

The film contains marvelous footage of a great, too-little-known piece of history. In the early 1930's Hitler began firing Jewish musicians. Overcoming extraordinary obstacles, world-renowned violinist Bronislaw Huberman relocated these great musicians to Palestine and in 1936 formed what later became known as the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra. This documentary chronicles this remarkable and heroic feat. Huberman, who led this exodus, is credited with saving about 1,000 people! His story is Inspirational and moving.

REMEMBER THE VICTIMS OF THE HOLOCAUST YOM HASHOAH MEMORIAL PROGRAM APRIL 8

JRLW and the Interfaith Committee of Leisure World will sponsor the annual Yom Hashoah – Holocaust Memorial Program Monday, April 8, at 1:30 pm in the Clubhouse II Auditorium.

The program will consist of readings by residents who are survivors and members of the four religious organizations in the community. Featured will be two speakers obtained through the US Holocaust Memorial Museum. The first speaker will be a survivor – Steve Fenves, who was liberated from Niederorschel, a satellite of Buchenwald, in 1945. The second is Ambassador John Withers whose father during the second World War was there to liberate Dachau; he served the United States as the Ambassador to Albania from 2007 to 2010.

Clergy and members of the Interfaith Chapel, Lady of Grace Catholic Church, the Unitarian Universalists of Leisure World and JRLW will participate in readings pertinent to memorializing those who perished at the hands of the Nazis. Survivors will recite recollections of the Holocaust while lighting candles in memory of the victims, the six million Jews who died at the hands of the Nazis and for the millions of others who suffered the same fate.

A major theme of the program, in this period of Holocaust deniers, is to not only remember the Holocaust but caution the world to prevent similar genocides today and in the future.




