A SHIVA MINYAN



Recipe Corner

FRUIT COBBLER

Bobbye Hertz

Fruit mixture:

4-5 cups fresh, canned or frozen fruit**
2/3 cup sugar
2 TBSP flour
1/2 tsp cinnamon OR cardamom**

Dough:

cup flour (may use 1/3 white and 2/3 whole wheat)
 TBSP sugar
 1/2 tsp baking powder
 1/2 tsp salt
 1/2 cup canola oil
 TBSP milk or fruit juice
 egg

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

To prepare fruit mixture, put sliced fruit on the bottom of a 9" x 5" rectangular pan. Sprinkle with the next three ingredients. ** favorites are blueberries or blackberries with peaches -- use cardamom

apples, pears and peaches -- use cinnamon

For the dough, mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt in a bowl. Add oil and blend. Add liquid and egg, stir with a fork until blended.

Spoon dough on top of the fruit mixture. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes until the top is lightly browned.

Be creative, this is a very easy recipe that I have been making almost since I have been married.

ADAPTING TO CHANGING FAMILY DYNAMICS

Summer is a time when extended families get together for graduations, reunions, or vacations. But for some seniors, family visits can often be stressful and result in hurt feelings around how they feel they are being treated. Recently, I met with a woman who had just returned from her grandson's high school graduation and felt that her family had ignored her. She was devastated.

As families expand and children and grandchildren mature, seniors should take into account the following:

Grandchildren are growing up. Young grandchildren often get very excited about the specialness of visiting with grandparents, while by age 11 or 12 many

children become more preoccupied with their own pursuits. Find new ways to connect with them: have them show you how they use technology, go to a movie

together, or play a game that the whole family can enjoy.

Your pace vs. your family's pace. Adult children who are working have to pack their days and nights with their own responsibilities and their children's activities. Try to be patient and, before you visit, think

about and discuss with your children what you would like to do during your stay and how to adapt this to their schedules.

There is value in adapting. You can plan around different mealtimes than you may have at home. Bring some decaffeinated tea along with you if your family never has any on hand

and find out ahead of time what is already on the family's schedule during your visit.

You may have changed. It's possible that since you last visited with your family you have gone through some changes that are not under your control such as: your energy level, general health, vision, and hearing. If you feel less connected or involved with your family, perhaps it is because you are less able to interact with them as in the past.

Whatever is causing you discomfort in your family relationships, remember to communicate it to your loved ones. Let them know how their actions have made you feel and how you hope to improve this in the future. Address any problems early on so your emotions don't simmer or reach a boiling point.


