# JRLW President's Message

Your Board of Directors has created a program that negates the annual payment of dues. It is a **Life Membership** that requires a one-time payment based on your current age category. Considering the inevitability of a dues increase in future years, this becomes a long-term money saving opportunity. Becoming a **Life Member** is an individual option.

An example of a couple ages 70 and 76, the cost would be \$285 plus \$225 for a total one-time payment of \$510. If you decide to participate and have paid your dues already, those dues will be deducted (\$510 minus \$36 = \$474). As a non-profit organization, this is a tax-deductible contribution. Sometimes members want to pay their dues without being reminded each year.


# **CALLING GRANDPARENTS**




This is a simple recipe for a delicious summer soup. The ingredients aren't precise because you can use any fruits you have on hand, except blueberries which tend to give the soup a bluish tinge. Also it is made to your taste.

- 1 large container sour cream
- 1 cup ice cubes
- 1 can ginger ale
- 2 to 3 cups of cubed fruit (melons, strawberries, peaches, etc.)

Fresh mint.

Put ingredients in blender or food processor. You may have to do this in two batches. Blend until pureed. Serve while still chilled. Top with sprig of mint. Enjoy!

# SOCIAL SERVICES FOR HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS

U.S. Senators Barbara A. Mikulski and Ben Cardin (both D-Md.) along with Senator Mark Kirk (R-III.) have introduced a bill that would ensure that Holocaust survivors can better access needed services, such as health care and nutrition services, without having to live in a nursing or assisted living facility. The RUSH Act will amend the Older Americans Act of 1965 to provide needed protections for survivors of the Holocaust who managed to make it to the United States.

**Senator Mikulski** said, "This legislation follows through on our commitment to these survivors by ensuring that the services and community-based care they need are available to help them live more independent and active lives."

"We have an obligation to provide aging Americans access to the services that they need -- and the community support they deserve -- in a setting that is not mentally or physically exhausting or traumatizing. Holocaust survivors fled to our country because of persecution for who they were. These great Americans deserve our attention and our efforts to ensure that they are more able to age in place," said **Senator Cardin**.

This legislation addresses the challenges facing the nearly 130,000 survivors who reside both at home and at long-term care facilities by ensuring their special needs are recognized.


