During Services, before and after the Torah Reading, when the Torah is marched thru the aisles we all want to touch the holy scrolls. Please remember these simple steps: for those of us wearing Tallisum, touch your Tallit to the Torah cover first, then to your lips. If not wearing a Tallit, you may want to touch the prayer book to the Torah cover and then to your lips. If you want to touch the Torah cover with your fingers, that is fine. But please remember to touch the cover first and then put your fingers to your lips. We don't want to get lipstick on our beautiful Torah covers. Thanks.

CANTOR'S CORNER

Cantor Mike Kravitz

Some of you were in attendance in July when I gave a program of Jewish Music at Har Tzeon-Agudas Achim, and the selection with which I opened the program is called CHASSIDIC KADDISH. In my remarks prior to singing it, I talked about a man named Henry Rosenblatt. For those of you who weren't there, I'd like to retell Henry's story because I think it is an important one.

Henry lived from 1907-1998 and was not particularly famous during his lifetime. He was a cantor who also had a modest career as a concert and opera singer and would go on to teach at Julliard. But, Henry had a very famous father. His father was known as YOSSELE.

Yossele Rosenblatt was one of the giants of music in the first third of the 20th century. He sold huge quantities of cantorial recordings for both RCA Victor and Columbia, and his concerts were almost always sold out. He was friends with opera stars Enrico Caruso and John McCormack. In 1933 Yossele and Henry made a trip to the Holy Land for a series of concerts and both got a chance to see the Holy Land for the first time. On the afternoon of Sunday, June 18, 1933 the two men had a talk. Yossele had written a number of cantorial compositions, only some of which he had recorded. Many of the orchestrations that accompanied his recordings were not of top quality, and he talked to Henry about his completing proper accompaniments for his work. In an interview in the Tara Publications book THE MUSIC OF YOSSELE ROSENBLATT (p.16) Henry Rosenblatt quotes his father as saying "mein zun, ven dein tate vet shoin nisht zein do oif der velt vest du arois kumen mit deine nave bagleitungen tzu mein music" (my son, when your father will no longer be in the world, you will publish your new accompaniments for my music). Henry protested saying "Poppa, how can you talk that way? You are only 51 years old. Let's not even talk about that."

"No, no," Yossele said. "You are going to rewrite all the accompaniments."

That night, Yossele died.

True to his word, Henry continued to rewrite the accompaniments of the compositions. He would outlive his father by 63+ years and he spent much time over those years working on those accompaniments. It wasn't always easy. While in California working for Warner Brothers, the house in which Henry stored Yossele's musical notebooks burned to the ground. Only one of Yossele's handwritten manuscripts remained. So, Henry tried to restore some compositions from memory and reorchestrate others by listening to compositions his father had recorded...and based on his work with the accompaniment of the CHASSIDIC KADDISH (which Yossele did NOT record). Henry was very talented.

We are reminded in the Ten Commandments "Honor Your Father and Your Mother." I can't think of a better way to honor one's father than by keeping his memory alive through his music.

And, by the way, if you want to hear Henry Rosenblatt in opera, look for the name PAUL DENNIS. Henry came up with a different professional name because he DIDN'T want to get jobs based on his surname. He wanted the jobs to be based on his own merits as a singer. And he was good enough to be selected to play the Marquis D'Obigny in Verdi's LA TRAVIATA that was conducted by Arturo Toscanini and broadcast over NBC in December, 1946. The performance was issued in 1951 on RCA Victor records.

If you'd like to hear Yossele and Henry Rosenblatt sing together, you can find their recording of YAALE on the internet. Type in Youtube Yossele Rosenblatt Yaale. Henry joins in about halfway into the record.

EASY SUMMER SQUASH


2 yellow summer squash, sliced into rounds

- 1 large sweet (Vidalia) onion, sliced
- 1 can Hunt's diced tomatoes in sauce
- 2 tbsp dried basil flakes Olive oil

Saute' onions in olive oil until translucent. Add can of tomatoes and basil flakes. Bring to a simmer. Add the sliced squash. Cover tightly and cook on low heat for 1 to 1½ hours. Remove from heat and serve over pasta or rice. This is a good recipe for the slow cooker.

On November 4, our guest speaker will be John Withers. He will speak about his father's poignant and stirring life story. His father can be considered among the people we call "The Righteous Ones."


We will hold our annual card party on Wednesday, December 2. Once again, we will have kugels made by and donated by our members.




