The High Holidays begin with Rosh Hashanah on the evening of Sunday, October 2 and continue on October 3 and 4. Reform services will be held in the Interfaith Chapel and Conservative services will be held in Club House II in the Activities Room. Also, on Monday, October 3, we will conduct Tashlich services in front of the Overlook Building, weather permitting.

Yom Kippur services will begin with Kol Nidre on the evening of Tuesday, October 11, and continue on Wednesday, October 12. Again, Reform services will be held in the Interfaith Chapel and Conservative services will be held in the Activities room in CH II.

Break the Fast will be held in the Ballroom in Clubhouse I after the conclusion of the Conservative services on Wednesday, October 12.

CANTOR'S CORNER

August 5 will be an anniversary of sorts. No, it's not a wedding anniversary, birthday or any of the other standard anniversaries. August 5, 2016 marks the anniversary of something that happened right here in Leisure World on August 5. 1988. On that Friday evening, 28 years ago, I served as cantor at a JRLW service for the very first time!

There are still a few of you who remember my father, Benjamin Kravitz, who lived in Building 1 from early 1985 until he had to go into assisted living prior to his passing in August, 1996. He had gotten to know Irving Goldberg at services he attended, and when Irv announced that he hoped to bring High Holy Days services to Leisure World, my father told Irv about me and informed him that I was a cantor. Irv would tell me some time later that after my father had approached him, his (Irv's) thought was "sure he is (sarcastically). Every Jewish father's son is a cantor." But Irv agreed to meet with me and tell me of his plans.

We met formally for the first time in May, 1988. Irv asked me about my background and I showed him my resume. I had served congregations in Maryland from 1970-83 and had gone out of area for the High Holy Days from 1984-87, serving congregations in Pennsylvania and North Carolina. He asked if I could read torah without using the "ping pong method" which is a term describing the going back and forth between the torah and a book or sheet located off to the side. I explained that I had learned the 4 torah readings for my previous High Holy Days congregation and could do them directly from the scroll. He told me "you're hired." No singing for him. No singing in front of a religious committee. It is the ONLY time in my life that I was hired to be a cantor without having to sing for

anyone. It was probably just as well. I had tried to teach through laryngitis in completing the spring semester as a teacher at Walter Johnson High School, and my voice was in no shape to sing. Irv told me not to worry. "You'll sing at the Friday evening service in August," he said and continued "and our people will get the chance to see what you Resting my voice in June and can do." July, it had fully recuperated by August 5. I came out to Leisure World on a hot, muggy Washington-area Friday night, expecting a sparse crowd given how uncomfortable it was outside. Lo and behold, when I walked into the Interfaith Chapel and looked down from the bimah, I saw close to 200 people. It was like a shot of adrenaline, and I was excited to sing. I was told afterwards that I sang pretty well, and Irv and I continued to work on what he and I would do during those first-ever Leisure World High Holy Days services. Those services were a success and we would make plans to do them again in 1989. And then 1990. High Holy Day services would continue to be conducted every year, and this fall for the Jewish year 5777, JRLW will conduct High Holy Day services for the 29th consecutive year.

Serving all these years has been a source of great pride, but there is a touch of sadness in realizing that most of the people who attended that first service are now of blessed memory. I like to think positively, so I won't dwell on that and I look at all the positive changes that have taken place at services during that time. We now have a Shabbat morning service with Kiddush once a month, Torah and Talmud study services on all the other shabbatot as well as full services for all of the Sholosh Regalim (pilgrimage festivals) where Yizkor is recited and a service to celebrate Purim. We have come a long way.

Let me wish each of you a pleasant rest-ofsummer and look forward to seeing you at services to come.

peanut butter cooKler

I remember these cookies that my Mom used to make. She used margarine instead of butter. She would put a thin icing on the cookies for company.



Ingredients

- 2 1/2 cups unbleached all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 pound (2 sticks) salted butter
- 1 cup packed dark brown sugar
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup extra-crunchy peanut butter
- 2 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Preparation

- Adjust oven rack to low center position. Heat oven to 350 degrees. In a medium bowl, sift flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Set aside. In the bowl of the electric mixer or by hand, beat butter until creamy. Add sugars and beat until fluffy, about 3 minutes, scraping sides as necessary. Then beat in crunchy peanut butter until fully incorporated, followed by eggs and vanilla. Gently stir dry ingredients into peanut butter mixture.
- 2. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Drop dough onto sheet in spoonfuls a little bigger than a golf ball, about two inches apart. Dip a fork in cold water and then press the back into dough, repeating to make a crisscross.
- 3. Bake until cookies are puffed and slightly brown along edges, but not top, about 15 minutes. Cool cookies on cookie sheet until set. Transfer to wire rack to cool completely.
