The agreements are not available if death has already occurred and the family is looking for relief. While both will adjust the prices somewhat because of membership in JRLW, the savings will not be the same as in preplanned agreements.

Judean Gardens has issued its new program for JRLW and the latest information reveals that total savings, including burial costs and bronze markers, can amount to \$1,180.00. THE STURGEON QUEEN DOCUMENTARY FILM

Four generations of a Jewish immigrant family created *Russ and Daughters*, a Lower East Side lox and herring emporium that thrives to this day. The documentary features interviews with two of the original daughters, now 100 and 92 years old. A discussion will follow.

Russ and Daughters opened in 1914. This year the still-thriving cured-fish palace celebrates its 100th anniversary. The film brings together six colorful longtime fans of the store who are in their 80's and 90's. Filmmaker Julie Cohen flew down to Pembroke Pines, Florida, to interview the two surviving members of Russ and Daughters' second generation owners.

WHO STOLE MY CHANUKAH?

My memories of Chanukah go back to when I was a young

child. We had a tin Chanukah Menorah. Each night of Chanukah we would light the orange candles—one for each night plus the 'helper' candle. Sometimes we would get a small gift. I remember going with my older brother Leonard one year to the 5&10¢ store to get presents for our family.

One night during the holiday the whole family would gather at my Bubbe's home. We each got a gift. I got a paper doll cutout book one year. Wow! There were latkes and songs and dreidel games. We had a wonderful time visiting with cousins.

Every year my father would drive us to downtown D.C. to see the beautiful window displays at Woodies and Hechts. The holiday windows were, of course, all decked out for Christmas. But all we cared about were the elves, the beautiful snow scenes and the colorful boxes and toys that were displayed.

As I grew older, I realized that not everyone celebrated Chanukah; many of my friends celebrated Christmas. That was o.k. with me. We had our own holiday—Chanukah.

When I married, we had a simple chrome Menorah in place of the tin one. When our boys were old enough, they helped light the orange candles each night of Chanukah. There was a small gift most nights and a larger gift one night during the holiday. We ate latkes, we sang songs and played dreidel games. In Sunday school, the boys learned the story of the brave people who fought off the strong army, cleaned out the Temple and found enough oil to light the Menorah for one night. But a miracle happened and the oil lasted eight days, which is why we celebrate Chanukah for eight days.

Somewhere along the way, my Chanukah got misplaced. Now there are fancy Chanukias

in different shapes instead of Chanukah Menorahs. There are decorations to be put up and multi-colored candles to be lit. And the gifts! The simple gifts have become large, expensive gifts. I believe we are competing with that other holiday that most of the people around us celebrate in December.

Both holidays celebrate what is believed to have been a miracle. But would it be so bad if we Jews went back to celebrate Chanukah the simple way we used to? Does Chanukah have to match or outdo Christmas? I wonder.

RECIPE CORNER

FROSTED FRUIT SALAD

As a rule, I do not usually serve gelatin type salads, but this is the exception!

6 ounce box lemon gelatin

2 cups boiling water

2 cups lemon-lime soda

1 cup miniature marshmallows

20 oz can crushed pineapple, drained, with liquid reserved for topping

3 large bananas, sliced

2 tablespoons flour

½ cup sugar

1 cup reserved pineapple juice

1 large egg, slightly beaten

1 cup whipping cream

1/4 cup grated Cheddar cheese

3 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

In a medium bowl, combine the gelatin with the boiling water, stirring until dissolved. Cool 10 minutes, stir in the soda and refrigerate until mixture starts to set, about 45 – 60 minutes. Fold in marshmallows, drained pineapple and bananas and place in a 9" x 13" dish. Chill until firm.

Prepare topping by cooking the flour, sugar, pineapple juice and egg in a small pan over low heat. Cook and stir continuously until mixture is thick. Remove the pan from heat and let it cool. Refrigerate topping until it is well chilled. Beat the whipping cream until stiff and fold into the chilled topping mixture. Spread the topping over the chilled gelatin mixture and sprinkle the Cheddar and Parmesan cheeses over the topping. Place salad in refrigerator and chill until serving. Serves 10 to 12.

This recipe is from my sister Sheilah Kaufman's cookbook "Simply Irresistable." I use extra cheese, cream and sugar as we love cheese. Cooking tip: Use fruit juices, 7-up or other drinks instead of water. What a difference the taste is.


