JEWISH WAR VETERANS POST 567 AT LEISURE WORLD

A BRIEF HISTORY OF OUR POST. It's a matter of historical record that Jews have served honorably and proudly in the defense of our country. Beginning well before the founding of our country, Jews were standing guard at the stockades in early colonial days and served with distinction throughout all of our country's wars and conflicts, including the present day Middle East Wars.

The founding of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States of America was in response to the growing anti-Semitism following the end of the Civil War. Despite the fact that Jews served in equal or greater proportion to its population than that of any other ethnic or religious group, on both sides of the conflict, and given that seven Jewish Union soldiers were awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for bravery and many who fought brother against brother were killed or wounded in action, it was extremely hurtful that the anti-Semites would raise the untruth that Jews did not serve. It was primarily for this reason that the Jewish War Veterans of the USA were established on March 15, 1896.

Of notable interest to our Leisure World family and fellow veterans is that one of the founding members of JWV was Corporal Isadore Kahn, of the 2nd Missouri Infantry, who was wounded at the battle of Pearidge, Arkansas. His grandson Bert Marks, a veteran of WWII and a valued member of JWV Post 567 is a long time resident of Leisure World. It sure is a small world.

Our Post here at Leisure World had its origin in Washington, D.C. some 70 years ago as the Nation's Capital Post 386. It was subsequently renamed Chaplain Alexander D. Goode Post 386 after one of the four Chaplains who drowned with the sinking of the troopship, USS Dorchester, in the North Atlantic. Years later, when our members moved from D.C. to

Maryland in early 2000, our Post was renamed the Charles B.Krieger Post 567 after one of its most distinguished members. In the tradition of those who founded the JWV organization in 1896, the members here at Leisure World have banded together to defend our country and its Constitution, care and support our veterans, defend the fair name of the Jew and combat anti-Semitism, and support the men and women in the military services.

The Jewish War Veterans is the oldest active veterans organization in America who have nobly served the veteran community, the Jewish community, the Leisure World community and beyond. We are truly the Patriotic Voice of American Jewry.

The next JWV Sunday Brunch will be held in March. More details will follow in the JRLW March Newsletter.

Those interested in joining JWV Post 567 are most welcome to attend our membership meetings in Clubhouse I, at 11:00 am, on the first Wednesday of the month. You will enjoy the good fellowship and refreshments. We would love to have you.



This event will last a lifetime in memory and through the years grow to be more valuable than medals. RECIPE CORNER

APPLE RAISIN BETTY

- 4 cups sliced apples
- 1/3 cup raisins
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 2 cups corn flakes cereal, crushed to 1/2 cup
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp ground nutmeg
- 1/4 cup margarine or butter, softened

Preheat oven to 375°. Lightly grease 8-inch square baking pan. Combine apples, raisins and lemon juice. Pour into prepared pan, set aside. Combine cereal, sugar, brown sugar, flour, cinnamon and nutmeg. Cut in margarine until mixture forms coarse crumbs; sprinkle over fruit mixture. Bake 35 minutes or until apples are tender and top is lightly browned. Serve warm. Makes 6 servings.


