Now that Shavuot is over, the Religious Committee is preparing for the High Holy Days. This year the High Holy Days will be "late," but will be upon us before we know it. Rosh Hashana begins on the evening of Wednesday, September 28, and concludes on Friday, September 30.

Yom Kippur starts with Kol Nidre at 6:40 pm on Friday, October 7, and ends with Shofar Sounding at 7:05 pm on Saturday, October 8.

Break-the-fast will follow immediately afterward,

We are fortunate to have all of our Clergy coming back to us this year: Rabbi Bernstein and Cantor Berkson will conduct our Reform Services, while Rabbi Fink and Cantor Kravitz will officiate at the Conservative Services.

This year, during the Conservative Services, we will be using the Machzor edited by Rabbi Harlow, first published in 1978, instead of the Rabbi Silverman Machzor first published in 1939. We are able to use a more modern Machzor due to the kindness of B'nai Shalom of Olney who donated to us their "old" Machzorim.

We look forward to enjoyable and inspiring services and hope for a good turnout. Elsewhere in this Newsletter is a form to fill out for the purchase of your High Holy Day tickets. Please be sure to let us know whether you would like to receive an honor and whether you can read Hebrew. It would help our committee to give out honors if we know whether you are a Kohen or a Levi.

## RECIPE CORNER



### GREEK TOSSED PASTA SALAD

It's too hot to cook, so how about a cold pasta salad? Here's an easy one.

1 cup spiral pasta- or-  
 1 box Betty Crocker Suddenly Salad Caesar pasta salad mix  
 ¼ cup water  
 3 tablespoons vegetable oil  
 4 cups torn romaine lettuce  
 2 medium tomatoes, coarsely chopped  
 1 small cucumber, coarsely chopped  
 ½ cup thinly sliced red onion, slices cut in half  
 4 oz crumbled feta cheese  
 1 can (2 ¼ oz) sliced ripe olives, drained  
 ½ cup croutons

Empty pasta mix (or spiral pasta) into 3-quart saucepan 2/3 full of boiling water. Gently boil 12 minutes, stirring occasionally. Drain pasta; rinse with cold water and drain well.

In large bowl, stir oil and water (if using Betty Crocker mix, add the seasoning packet). You can use your favorite vinegarettte in place of oil and water. Stir in pasta and remaining ingredients. Toss with croutons. Serve immediately or refrigerate for later.

I already had the shoes to go with it (platform ankle straps were the height of fashion) and a borrowed evening bag. I had it all.....all except a date.

My best friend Shirley was going to attend with her latest beau, Mel Karpel, who was the butt of many jokes and jabs by the sorority sisters because his name rhymed. You know, "How is Mel and his sister Estelle?". or "Mel Karpel is really swell". We thought we were being funny, but actually we weren't. We were being jealous. I had no intention of going alone to the dance, although attending solo was being

done in those days if you could claim to be on a committee -- food, entertainment, music. Pick one. It helped you to save face. He said he would bring me a purple flower, which I assumed to be an orchid. I bragged that fact to all my friends. When the doorbell rang, I answered it and nobody was there. I looked down and there was Stein.....holding a box of purple carnations. Shirley and Mel were to meet us at the ballroom. When we arrived, they were nowhere in sight. We got to know each other quickly with each whirl around the floor, as Stein's face was in the neighborhood where my Living Bra lived. I kept watching the door but Shirley and Mel never showed up. Her explanation was that Mel couldn't make it. Of course he couldn't. He wasn't able to materialize, because it seems that she had dreamed him up! No such luck for me. Oh, why oh why had I never learned Yugoslavian!??? Finally, it was time to leave. Ellis Stein was driving a brand new Chevrolet, and we went to the Hot Shoppe for curb service. Stein ordered tea. When my cheeseburger arrived, he clasped his hand to his cheek. "Meat with cheese?" he said incredulously. "Your father knows this?" I nodded. All he said was, "Oh".
