

CANTOR'S CORNER

I began thinking about the July, 2017 column the day after the Women's Shabbat service in May. For those of you who participated or were in attendance and watched all those who participated, it was a spectacular day. We have a lot of very talented people in Leisure World, and many of them are WOMEN. I was thinking of the words from "A WOMAN OF VALOR" which I read during the service, specifically the last sentence which reads "Give her of the fruit of her hands, and let her works praise her in the gates." I decided I'd use this column, in the month that the Declaration of Independence began the process of freedom from the rule of King George, to talk about one particular woman who exemplified that line. Her name was Abigail Minis, and her achievements, both as a woman and immigrant to America, are a testament to what talent, ingenuity, conviction and determination can do when they operate together.

Most accounts say that she was born in 1701 and all accounts agree that she died in 1794 which means that she lived for 93 years, incredible for that time. Little is known about her life in England. She and her husband Abraham had two young daughters at the time. They decided to leave England in 1733 for the new world, joining about 40 other Jews on the ship WILLIAM AND SARAH which set sail for a new colony that had been established in 1732 by Governor James Oglethorpe and named for King George III. The colony was named "Georgia," and it had only been in existence for about six months when the Minis family arrived. The Trustees of Georgia, based in London, were not thrilled that Jews would be among the settlers in this new land. Oglethorpe received a letter which read in part, "The Trustees have heard with concern of the arrival of forty Jews with a design to settle in Georgia. They (the Trustees) hope they (the Jews) will meet with no sort of encouragement and desire. Sir, you will use your best endeavors that the said Jews may be allowed no kind of settlement with any of the grantees." Having read this, not only did Oglethorpe NOT follow these orders, he allowed the Jews to settle in Savannah and deeded land to them. It was this land that allowed the Minis family to begin their lives in Georgia. They started a farm and had their third child, Philip, who was among the firstborn children of these settlers from England. Abigail would go on to have six more children. Though not

well-educated, she had a good head for business, and she and her husband would work together to increase their land holdings. Upon his death in 1757, she ran the farm, looked to add land holdings and start new businesses. At the time of her death some 36 years later, she had increased the 500 acres she and Abraham had accumulated to 2500 acres in Georgia and South Carolina. One of the businesses she would start was a tavern. She and her five unmarried daughters opened the tavern in 1763 and they would run it until 1779.

But it is what she did during the American Revolution that made her the subject of this column. She was an avid supporter of the War, supplying provisions for the Continental Army, the Georgia militia and French forces in Georgia. Her efforts were not without risks. Savannah fell to the British in December, 1778, and there were Loyalists who urged that her property be confiscated. Knowing the danger they were in, Abigail and her daughters petitioned the Governor of Georgia for safe passage to Charleston, South Carolina, and protection of their Savannah property. Both were granted, and following the War's end, Abigail and her family returned to Savannah. Abigail resumed her business activities in which she remained active until her death.

I thought about what she might tell people today if she could come back for an interview. I'd like to think she would tell young people, "Don't let anyone tell you what you can't do." At a time when women stayed at home to raise children and did not work outside the home, Abigail managed to both raise her children and start/operate successful businesses. I'd like to think she would tell seniors, "You are never too old to do the things you love." She could have easily stepped down from all her endeavors during the last years of her life - but she didn't. Finally, I think her message to everyone about freedom would be, "Freedom isn't free - you have to fight for it." She was 78 when she helped provide supplies for the soldiers fighting the British, and she did not let her age stop her from doing all she could to make the American dream a reality. So, as the Fourth of July is upon us, here's to YOU, Abigail Minis. Your legacy is that of a woman of valor, and may your works continue to be praised in the gates.

The Jewish people's Judaic culture and their heritage of being denied civil rights unified the Jewish people in support of civil rights for all. Several prominent Jews stand out as civil rights advocates, e.g., lawyer Louis Marshall, NY Governor Herbert Lehman and Congressman Jacob Javits. The greatest rabbinical fighter for social justice was Rabbi Stephen S. Wise. He believed that Jews are divinely dedicated to seek justice for all people (now explicitly included in Conservative Jewish prayers).

True story. My husband died one month before the Bar Mitzvah of our youngest son, David. Our Rabbi would not let us postpone the Bar Mitzvah. So, that month was filled with preparations for the day. David was kept busy between school work and studying for his part of the services. The day came. David was very well prepared. The Synagogue was packed. CONVERSO JEWS in NEW MEXICO

Recently we went to New Mexico and took a course given by Road Scholar called Conversos and CryptoJews. 




