## BUBBE FANNIE'S SIMPLE SALMON CAKES

1- 7<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz can Red Salmon

7 Nabisco Premium crackers (unsalted tops)

1 egg

Seasonings to taste

2 tbsps margerine

Crumble crackers in bowl. Add drained salmon, one egg and seasonings. Put margarine in frying pan and melt. Make six salmon cakes and lightly brown in the melted margarine.

Put the salmon cakes on a cookie sheet and bake in moderate oven. When browned on one side, turn over and brown on the other side. Be careful not to overcook.

Drain salmon cakes on paper towels and serve hot.

## WHAT'S IN A NUMBER?

The intriguing study of numbers and their relation to words, phrases, worship and holidays is replete with example, opinions and varied information from many sources. This is simply a cursory introduction to the intricate, absorbing and fascinating subject of the relationship of numbers in Judaism.

The Gematria is the name of a system that gives numerical value to a word or group of words. People in ancient times assigned numerical values to the letters in their alphabet and to words and phrases that bore some relation to each other. The addition or multiplication of numbers augments or alters the meaning of the individual numbers.

Some examples are:

**Number 3.** This is a symbol of holiness. The sacredness of this number probably is due to the fact that primitive man divided the universe into 3 regions—heaven, earth and water. It signifies completeness and stability. The word "holy" is repeated three times in the Kedusha, the third section of the Amidah.

**Number 4.** The Tetragrammaton which forms the name of the Supreme Being, YHWH, is transliterated as Yahweh but was substituted by Adonai or Elohim because it was too sacred. This number occurs often—the Four Questions, four main directions.

**Number 7.** This letter is one of the, if not the most, sacred numbers. It is composed of 3, the universe, and 4, The Tetragrammaton. Examples of the use of 7 are: the world, created in 6 days and the seventh day, Shabbat. Seven years of work demanded of Jacob by Laban for the release of Rachel. (Jacob did double duty in his case.)

<u>Number 12.</u> This is a product of 3 and 4. (See above.) It represents wholeness, the completeness of God's purpose. There were 12 tribes of Israel, 12 sons of Jacob, etc.

<u>Number 13.</u> In biblical times Rabbis believed that the age of majority for boys was

13 and for girls 12. They asserted there was a new development in their growth where impulsive tendencies gave way to physical, intellectual and moral growths!!! Therefore, beginning at those ages children were obligated to perform the commandments. This is the meaning of bar/bat mitzvoth.

**Number 18.** According to the Gematria that assigns a numerical value to Hebrew letters, the letters chet and yod add up to eighteen, chet with the value of 8 and yod with the value of 10. Together they spell the word chai, life. This number is used to wish good luck, life.

**Number 40.** This number represents a time of transition or a passage from one place to another. It is a change in time or period, often uncertain or unknown. The flood lasted 40 days and 40 nights. The Jews wandered for 40 years in the wilderness. Moses spent 40 days on Mount Sinai.

These are examples of the importance of numbers in Judaism.

## Bill Paying Stressing You Out? The Senior Connection Volunteers Can Help!

When I write this column for you each month I carefully consider my topic. As a clinician with JSSA, I often lean toward topics related to mental health. This month is no exception. I want to share information about a new service that is offered by a non-profit in Montgomery County. The Senior Connection has been quietly doing the work of a small army providing volunteer driving to help older adults get to their doctor's appointments.

But that's not the only way The Senior Connection can help! Does paying your bills month each make vou uncomfortable or are you concerned that you may not understand an invoice you received? Perhaps your spouse used to pay the bills and you don't have much experience with the process. Paying bills is stressful for many of us. Please do not let your discomfort keep you from seeking outside assistance from your family, a trusted friend or, yes, from The Senior Connection!

The qualifying guidelines for bill paying assistance as set up by The Senior Connection are very generous. A single adult over the age of 61 qualifies if their income is not more than \$45,500. A couple can earn up to \$52,000 in combined income as long as assets do not exceed that same amount. Do note that assets do not include your primary residence, your car, retirement accounts, or life insurance policies.

So folks, if you are ready to reduce the stress that can come from bill paying – there is someone that can help! You'll be amazed by how much better you will feel and you may even learn that you can pay your bills without help. 

## Azerbaijani Fun Day:

## An Intergeneration Experience

by Fred Shapiro, JRLW Community Liaison The Jewish Residents of Leisure World and the Karabakh Foundation will present an Azerbaijani Fun Day Sunday, JULY 8, 2012, 1-5 PM IN CLUBHOUSE I The theme for the Fun Day is to provide an intergenerational festival for the purpose of learning about the country of Azerbaijan. Cost for attending the program will be \$6.00 per adult and \$2.00 for older children; no charge for children under 12.. Tickets for adults will be available from the E&R office in Clubhouse I. Children's tickets will be sold at the event.

The festival will incorporate Azerbaijani mugham music, descriptions of traditional foods, crafts, storytelling, and more that highlight the complex and spectacular culture of the country of Azerbaijan. The Festival will highlight the ethnic diversity and culture of Azerbaijan. Participants in the Festival will include not only artists and craft presenters but also Azerbaijani residents of Washington, D.C, residents of Leisure World; and American friends of the Karabakh Foundation. The Foundation will invite staff of the Embassy of Azerbaijan to the United States to participate in an accompanying ceremony.

Leisure World residents will be asked to volunteer to read translated versions of Azerbaijani children's stories, while children will learn and then perform Azerbaijani folk dances.

Plans for the Fun Day include the Karabakh Foundation Dance Troupe teaching Azerbaijani folk dances, youngsters trying on Azerbaijani folk costume and learning to dance while wearing the costumes; craft making such as musical instruments and weavings, displays and explanation of Azerbaijani handicrafts, an Azerbaijani carpet display celebrates the exquisite designs and colors of Azerbaijani carpets. with the motifs explained by an Azerbaijani carpet expert. There will be a display of pictures of Azerbaijani's distinctive cuisine with discussions lead by expert chefs and an Interactive slideshow lead by visitors to Azerbaijan

Azerbaijan is a small country in the Caucasus region, bordering Georgia, Armenia, Russia, Turkey, Iran and the Caspian Sea. 99% Muslim (85% Shi'a), the country is proud of its pluralism; an ancient Jewish community of "mountain Jews" (from the Caucasus Mountains) has maintained its distinctive culture and language for centuries. Azerbaijan also maintains a strong friendly relationship with the State of Israel. In fact, Azerbaijan was among the first to respond to recent wildfires in Israel.

Because of its historic location on the Silk Road, Azerbaijan was and is a cultural crossroads that has brought out and reinterpreted the best of many cultures. The resulting Azerbaijani culture is extraordinarily sophisticated and multifaceted. Azerbaijan was home to the first Muslim opera and was the first Muslim republic to grant women's suffrage (in 1918—before the United States!). Few in the West realize that many of the world's treasured "Oriental carpets" are actually Azerbaijani in origin. Moreover, the United States Department of State considers Azerbaijani a critical language.

The Karabakh Foundation is a U.S. 501c(3) cultural charity foundation based in Washington, D.C., that seeks to increase awareness and understanding in the United States of the cultural heritage and traditions of the country of Azerbaijan, the Caucasus area, and the Karabakh region of Azerbaijan.
