

RECIPE CORNER

Blintz Soufflé for Shavuot

- 2 package frozen blintzes (You may want to alternate cheese and cherry blintzes)
- 3 eggs (you may substitute one 8oz package of 'egg beaters')
- 1½ cups sour cream
- 4 tablespoons butter (melted)
- 2 tablespoons orange juice
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1/4 cup sugar

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Grease a 2 quart baking pan. Layer frozen blintzes on bottom of pan. Put rest of ingredients in blender and blend until creamy. Pour over blintzes. Bake at 375° degrees for 15 minutes then reduce heat to 350° for 35 to 45 minutes, or until puffy and brown. Serve warm.

TALKING TO YOUR DOCTOR

On May 4, the Charles E. Smith Life Communities sponsored a lunch here in Leisure World. The featured speaker, Dr. Elisa Gil-Peres, gave a very informative presentation about what to consider when you speak to your doctor. Here are some of the suggestions she made:

>When you visit your doctor, bring someone with you to act as a 'second' pair of ears.

>Before your visit, write down any questions you may want to ask. We all get a little nervous going to the doctor's office and we may forget something we wanted to ask.

>Bring all of your medication bottles with you, including over-the-counter meds. Your doctor can go over each and determine which ones to continue or which ones may have interactions with other medications.

>Ask the doctor, "What are my major medical problems?" "What should I worry about?"

>Always keep an updated list of medications and the dosage of each with you in your wallet or purse. Also, along with this list, keep the name and phone number of the person to contact in case of an emergency.

>Do not underestimate the power of exercise, healthy diet and enough sleep.

>Take time to discuss with your doctor your end-of-life wishes. There is a Maryland state form, MOLST (Maryland Medical Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment) which you should discuss with your children and go over with your doctor. Fill out and sign this form and have your primary physician sign it. Keep this document up to date with any changes. Make certain that your doctor, as well as your hospital, keeps a copy of this form in your records.




