CANTOR'S CORNER

I had a very interesting conversation following the service on April 8. A gentleman who had been in attendance reminded me of the article I wrote about Yossele Rosenblatt two years ago. In that article I had mentioned Yossele's son Henry who had accompanied his father on a trip to the Holy Land in 1933, a trip that would culminate in Yossele's death in June of that year. That makes this year the 84th yahrtzeit of Yossele's untimely passing.

What I hadn't mentioned in the article was Yossele's son Samuel who for years served as rabbi of Beth T'filoh congregation in Baltimore. This gentleman had celebrated his bar mitzvah at Beth T'filoh congregation with Rabbi Rosenblatt officiating. It was not the first time someone from JRLW has come up to me to tell me that Rabbi Rosenblatt had been his rabbi. I don't know if Rabbi Rosenblatt had any of the singing talents of his father or brother Henry. And, by the way, Yossele Rosenblatt and his wife were parents of 8 children. I'm not aware if any of the other 6 made it to any prominence. But, Rabbi Samuel Rosenblatt is noted for more than his years as rabbi at Beth T'filoh.

He is also the author of a book titled YOSSELE ROSENBLATT. The title page continues with "the story of his life as told by his son Samuel Rosenblatt." I own a copy of this book and it is a prized possession in my library. It's not that it is particularly collectible in the used book market because it isn't. It's because it was given to me by someone who knew I would appreciate it and it was a part of his vast Jewish library that he wanted to go to someone from the next generation after his.

I'm bringing this up because many of you knew the person who gave me this book. He was the man who hired me back in 1988 when he had the dream of making High Holy Days services

a reality for the residents of Leisure World who wanted to be able to pray together with people who were their contemporaries. He and I would conduct High Holy Days services together at Leisure World from 1988 until 2003 when he could no longer stand for the duration of the services. He left a major legacy here at Leisure World, and his name, of blessed memory, is IRVING GOLDBERG.

When Irv gave me the book, I devoured it. The insights were fascinating, but one story stood out in particular. Yossele had been hired to be in THE JAZZ SINGER, and they wanted him to come to California for the filming. He made it clear that there was a screen star he wanted to meet, and arrangements were made for Yossele to go to this man's estate. When Yossele arrived, the man was in his yard with a wind-up record player playing a 78 rpm record of one of Yossele's many RCA records, "Omar Rabbi Elozor (Rabbi Elozor Said)." This film star is quoted in the book (on p. 291). " 'I have all the records you have ever produced' said his host. 'I cherish them as among my most treasured possessions. Whenever I feel a little blue, I take them out and play them. They do something to me. They unite me - oh so closely - with my Jewish ancestors. Now you know why I am so happy to have the original, the master of the voice recorded on these disks, in my homestead.' "

The man making those comments? CHARLIE CHAPLIN. And Yossele never forgot that meeting or those comments.

I'll be doing a program of Jewish songs again this year. It will be on Thursday, June 29 at 1 p.m. at Congregation Har Tzeon-Agudath Achim, 1840 University Boulevard W. in Silver Spring. It is free and will have songs in Hebrew, Yiddish and English. One of the pieces will be Yossele Rosenblatt's composition "Shir Hamaalos (Song of Ascents)." It will be my tribute to a remarkable man. I hope to see you there. Chag Sameach for a joyous Shavuot!

ABOUT OUR HISTORY

Who were the earliest Jews to arrive in the Americas?

Spanish and Portuguese Marrano Jews (i.e., Christians who practiced some form of Judaism) joined the early Spanish and Portuguese invaders of America. They settled in the conquered territories covering the Caribbean, South America and Mexico. They suffered in South America when the Spanish Inquisition hunted down these Marranos in the New World. They lived comfortably in the Caribbean where they started to live openly as Jews, establishing many synagogues. They also lived in the southwestern United States where they were forced to hide their connection with Judaism. Even today, remnants of these Marranos have been found clinging to traces of Jewish practices, such as treating the Friday night dinner as a special family occasion with candle lighting, but with no religious significance. They are now addressed as Conversos.

Post-film, Ms. Barth will speak about how Germany has dealt with the legacy of the Holocaust. She also examines why Jews, and Israelis in particular, are moving to Germany in record numbers and how the government is very much encouraging it.



RECIPE CORNER

PEACHES FOR JUNE

Easy Peach Cobbler

1 can sliced peaches - not drained
 1 box yellow cake mix
 2/3 cup sugar, brown or white
 1 stick cold butter or margerine
 ground cinnamon



1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Pour canned peaches with juice into a 9x13 inch baking pan; make sure juices cover peaches. Mix peaches with 1/2 cup of the sugar and sprinkle cinnamon to taste into mixture.
2. Sprinkle dry cake mix evenly over top of peach mixture. Poke holes into cake mix to allow juice through. Cut stick of margarine into small pats (or coarsely grate), placing randomly over the top. Sprinkle with the remaining sugar and a light dusting of cinnamon.
3. Bake in preheated oven for 25 to 30 minutes, or until the juice mixture is bubbly and the top of the cake mix topping is crusty and golden brown.

However, as soon as Israel declared independence in 1948, its Arab neighbors attacked. Jordan took over East Jerusalem and the Old City. Nearly 20 years later, in the course of the Six-Day War, Nasser induced Syria and Jordan to begin attacks on Israel by claiming that Egypt had thwarted Israeli air strikes. Israel sent a message to King Hussein of Jordan saying that Israel would not attack Jerusalem or the West Bank as long as Jordan remained quiet. But, urged on by Egypt, Jordan began shelling Israel. Israel counter-attacked June 6 and on the following day, June 7, Israel captured the Old City of Jerusalem. Where were you in June 1967? What are your memories of this time?
