Light Carrots and Sweet Potato Tzimmes

Ingredients:
2 lbs. carrots
3 large sweet potatoes
1/2 cup honey
1/4 cup sugar
1 medium apple
salt to taste

Preheat oven to 350° .

Peel and slice carrots.
Slice the sweet potatoes in eighths.
In a large pot add cold water to cover the carrots and sweet potatoes.

Simmer slowly in uncovered pot until carrots and potatoes are soft. Most of the water should be absorbed.

Grease lightly a 2 quart glass dish.
Pour in mixture.
Bake (uncovered) at 350° until tzimmes thickens and begins to brown.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL
PROGRAM**

The Interfaith Committee of Leisure World will sponsor the annual Yom Hashoah Holocaust Memorial Program Monday, April 8, at 1:30 pm in the Clubhouse II Auditorium. The program will consist of readings by residents who are survivors and members of the different religious organizations in the community. The entire community of Leisure World is invited to attend and join in the remembrance of the horrors conceived of and carried out by the Nazi regime in Germany.

The program will feature two speakers who will share their experiences with us.

The first speaker will be a survivor – Steve Fenves, who was liberated from Niederorschel, a satellite of Buchenwald in 1945. The second is Ambassador John Withers whose father, during World War II, was there to liberate Dachau. He has served the United States as the Ambassador to Albania.

Steven Fenves was born in Subotica, Yugoslavia . In 1941 Yugoslavia was invaded and the Nazis placed Subotica under Hungarian occupation. In 1944 the Germans took control and moved the father to Auschwitz and the family into the ghetto and then to Auschwitz. He was then marched to Buchenwald from where he was liberated by the US Army.

John Withers story is somewhat different. His father was in an African-American unit that was at the liberation of Dachau. His father rescued two young Jewish survivors, having a reunion with them fifty five years later, an episode and story that gained the attention of the media and major humanitarian institutions. John joined the

State Department in 1984 and rose to be Ambassador to Albania in 2007. He is married and visits his mother Daisy, who lives here in Leisure World.

Clergy and members of the Interfaith Chapel, Lady of Grace Catholic Church, the Unitarian Church and JRLW will participate in memorializing those who perished in the hands of the Nazis. Survivors will recite recollections of the Holocaust while lighting candles in the memory of the victims. We all will recite portions of the program and light candles in memory of the six million Jews and other victims who died at the hands of the Nazis. A major theme of the program is to not only remember the Holocaust but to caution the world to prevent similar genocides today and in the future.

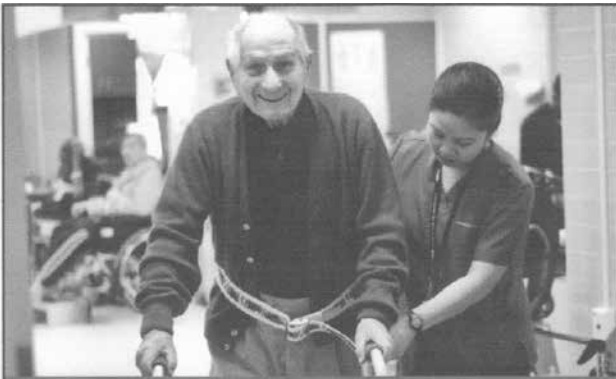

APRICOT NOODLE KUGEL

Marcia Crystal

8 oz noodles, cooked and drained
 4 eggs, well beaten
 1 cup sour cream
 2 T. **lemon juice**
 ½ cup oil
 ½ cup sugar
 10 oz jar apricot jam

Preheat oven to 350° degrees. In a large bowl, combine the cooked noodles, eggs, sour cream, lemon juice, oil and sugar. Turn half of the noodle mixture onto a greased 13 x 9 pan. Cover with jam, using the back of a spoon to spread evenly. Top with remaining noodle mixture. Bake at 350° degrees for 50 minutes or until golden brown. Serves 12.

SWEET KUGEL

Hazel Sperling

8 oz. wide noodles, cooked and drained
 ¼ lb butter – melted then cooled
 3 eggs, well beaten
 1 tsp cinnamon
 1 tsp vanilla
 1 cup white (golden) **raisins**
 ½ cup sugar
 1/8 tsp salt
 8 oz creamed cottage cheese
 8 oz sour cream

Mix all ingredients and pour into buttered pan, topped with cinnamon. Bake at 350° For about ¾ - 1 hour
