PURIM

Purim is a holiday that commemorates the deliverance of the Jewish people in the ancient Persian Empire where a plot had been formed to destroy them. The story is recounted in the Biblical Book of Esther and is a festive holiday that is celebrated on the 14th of Adar which this year falls on March 5, 2015.

Rabbi Gary Fink will officiate at our service in Clubhouse II in the exercise room. Services will start at 9:15 am with a short service and a reading of the Torah and will be followed by the reading of the Scroll of Esther or the Megillah.

It is customary to attend Megilla reading in costume and all JRLW members are

encouraged to dress up as characters from the Purim story. During the reading of the Megilla it is customary to boo, hoot or shake noisemakers (graggers) to express the dislike of the villain Haman when his name is mentioned.

Purim is festive holiday and refreshments will be provided by Rabbi Shmuel Leigh of the Golden Network. We are also commanded to enjoy a festive meal and to get so drunk that we can't tell the difference between Mordechai (the hero) and Haman (the villain). In addition to the Shalach Manot provided by Rabbi Leigh we will provide coffee and tea, but not anything stronger, although members of JRLW are encouraged to bring their own refreshments.

Editorial

JE SUIS. . . . I AM A JEW. . I AM AFRAID.

Last month we observed the 70th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. And we said, once more, "Never again!"

Last month thousands came together in Paris to show solidarity against the horrific killings there by an extreme Islamic organization. Almost as an aside, the media reported the killing of some people in a kosher market. Anti-Semitism is nothing new in France. It is growing. We don't discuss it--maybe because we don't want to believe it. synagogue bombed there, a Jewish couple walking down the street being beaten for no reason other than that they were Jews. When Bibi Netanyahu suggested that the Jews living in France should move to Israel, the media indicated that he should not have said that. We Americans thought it was a polite gesture. But was it?

Last summer as rockets rained down on Israel, Britons ranked the Jewish state right between North Korea and Iran as the country they hate second most in the world.

Here, in the United States, after the University of California, Davis, student government passed a bill encouraging the university to divest from Israel, some of the bill's anti-Israel supporters celebrated by painting a swastika on the house of a Jewish fraternity. That is anti-Semitism.

Anti-Semitism is again growing in Europe and throughout the world.

Each year, here in Leisure World, we hold an observance in memory of the six million. It is a very moving service. We Jews living in

Leisure World know all about the Holocaust. Our children know because we made certain that they did. How about our grandchildren? Do you tell them about the horrors of Hitler's Europe? If we don't, who will?

We have an impressive Holocaust Museum here in Washington, D.C. School children are routinely taken there on a field trip. Some are impressed; some are happy to have an excuse to get away from school for a day. There is a movement now to stop teaching about the Holocaust in public schools, because it is an affront to the Muslim students.

We must find a way to make certain that the world does not forget. We are seeing acts of anti-Semitism grow again throughout the world. Here, in this area we feel safe. We can go to the kosher store without fear. When visiting in France, Jews are advised not to wear their Star of David so that it shows. Here, in this area, some synagogues are hiring guards on the High Holy Days. In Europe synagogues are bombed and the world takes little notice.

In my home, at the Passover Seder we spill an extra drop of wine in memory of the six million who are not able to celebrate Passover. What will you do to make certain that future generations do not forget?

There is a quote from Julius Lester: "History is not just facts and events. History is also a pain in the heart and we repeat history until we are able to make another's pain in the heart our own."

I am a Jew. I am afraid.

1. Aspects of Israel: Complex & Beautiful 10:00am – 11:00am

This course will explore the many facets of Israeli society. Six different Israeli shlichim (emissaries) in our community will discuss – military experience, the land and its beauty, Israeli history, Israel as "Start-Up Nation" and the impact of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict on Israeli society.

2. Exploring Ultra-Orthodox Life in Israel 11:15am – 12:15pm

An examination of the Ultra-Orthodox sector of Israeli society through the lens of the Israeli TV series *Shtisel*. *Shtisel* won the Israeli Academy Award for Best TV Drama in 2014. Each session will begin with a short introduction followed by a screening of an episode of the Israeli TV program. Q&A and discussion will follow each screening. See a different slice and gain some new insight into Ultra-Orthodox life.

This class will explore many complex issues surrounding who is a Jew, what impacts the strength of one's Jewish identity, especially the ever more fragile identity of our youth. Threats to Jewish identity and how Israel, social activism, and one's background plays into identity and inevitably the strength of the Jewish community. Each week will feature a different Rabbi or Jewish educator each with a unique perspective.




THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS WITH MOLLY




