

#### RAISIN SPICE OATMEAL COOKIES

(Low Fat)

- 1 cup flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup unsweetened applesauce
- 1 egg white
- 2 tbsp water
- 2 tbsp canola oil
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 1/3 cup quick-cooking rolled oats
- 1 cup raisins

Preheat oven to 375°. Coat 2 or 3 large baking sheets with no-stick spray.

In a small bowl combine flour, baking powder, baking soda and cinnamon. Mix well. In a large bowl combine the brown sugar, applesauce, egg white, water, oil and vanilla. Mix well. Stir in flour mixture. Add the oats and raisins. Mix well.

Drop by rounded teaspoons, 2 inches apart, on baking sheets. Bake one sheet at a time for 10 minutes or until lightly browned.

Place baking sheet on a wire rack and let stand for 5 minutes. Remove cookies from baking sheet and cool on rack. Makes 35 - 42 cookies. Freezes well. (Good with some chocolate chips added to the batter)

#### **CANTOR'S CORNER**

The subject of this month's column is named Albert, and he was chosen because March 14 marks the 137th anniversary of his birth. While Germany was the country of his birth, he left Germany in 1933 and spent the latter years of his life in the United States as professor of Physics at Princeton University. You all know about Albert's achievements in the scientific world. What you may not know is that Albert was a proficient violinist and, especially in the last years of his life, a brilliant writer on subjects other than science. I'd like this article to concentrate on those facets of Albert's life.

A German music critic heard him play in the late 1920's and, apparently unaware of his academic claim to fame, described what he heard with "his (violin) playing is excellent but he does not deserve his world fame; there are many others just as good." Albert's fame was such that it opened doors that might have been closed to other people. He had the chance to play with Beethoven specialist Artur Schnabel, a world-class pianist. According to one version of a story frequently told by musicians, the two were playing a Beethoven Sonata when Albert got lost in the score and missed an entrance. Schnabel was said to slam his hands on the keyboard and exclaim "Albert- CAN'T YOU COUNT?"

I am sure that all of you have figured out by now that the aforementioned Albert is Albert EINSTEIN. In the last years of his life, he was very devoted to Jewish causes and was even offered the Presidency of the State of Israel which he turned down. He stipulated that on his death, his papers would be donated to the Hebrew University. In 1954, the year before his death, a book he wrote was published by Bonanza Books and was entitled IDEAS AND OPINIONS. Part of that book, a section entitled "Why Do They Hate the Jews?" was excerpted in a two volume set published in 1968. That set was entitled MODERN JEWISH LIFE IN LITERATURE and was edited by Azriel Eisenberg. I began my Jewish teaching career

in 1968 and I used this pair of books with my students. I was fascinated by what Einstein had written and have come back to his words a number of times over the years. I'd like to share some excerpts from that book.

"The bond that has united the Jews for thousands of years and that unites them today is, above all, the democratic ideal of social justice, coupled with the ideal of mutual aid and tolerance among all men. Even the most ancient religious scriptures of the Jews are steeped in these social ideals which have powerfully affected Christianity and Mohammedanism and have had a benign influence upon the social structure of a great part of mankind. The introduction of a weekly day of rest should be remembered here- a profound blessing to all mankind. Personalities such as Moses, Spinoza and Karl Marx, dissimilar as they may be, lived and sacrificed themselves for the ideal of social justice; and it was the tradition of their forefathers that led them on this thorny path. The unique accomplishments of the Jews in the field of philanthropy spring from the same source.

The second characteristic trait of Jewish tradition is the high regard in which it holds every form of intellectual aspiration and spiritual effort. I am convinced that this great respect for intellectual striving is solely responsible for the contributions the Jews have made toward the progress of knowledge, in the broadest sense of the term. In view of their relatively small number and the considerable external obstacles constantly placed in their way on all sides, the extent of these contributions deserves the admiration of all sincere men. I am convinced that this is not due to any special wealth of endowment, but to the fact that the esteem in which intellectual accomplishment is held among the Jews creates an atmosphere particularly favorable to the development of any talents that may exist. At the same time a strong critical spirit prevents blind obeisance to any mortal authority.

I have confined myself here to these two traditional traits, which seem to me to be the most basic. These standards and ideals find expression in small things as in large. They are transmitted from parents to children; they color conversation and judgment among friends; they fill the religious scriptures; and they give to the community life of the group its characteristic stamp. It is in these distinctive ideals that I see the essence of Jewish nature."

So, as we remember Albert Einstein on the 137th anniversary of his birth, let's remember a man of many talents, one who possessed one of the greatest scientific minds of all time who remained fiercely proud of his Jewish heritage throughout his lifetime. His words are just as timely now as when they were written.

## GOOD DEEDS DAY IN LEISURE WORLD

Leisure World joins the Greater Washington community, along with hundreds of thousands of volunteers from around the world, in a day of service on April 10. Two projects will be observed here in Leisure World. The first is the annual collection of food for the needy and homeless in Clubhouse I. The second, sponsored by JRLW, is a return of the Jewish Day School students to coach our seniors about current communication and computer technology in Clubhouse II.

Co-sponsored by NAAMAT and the Jewish War Veterans Post 567, volunteers will be manning a table in Clubhouse I to collect containers of food for donation to MANNA. Residents are urged to take a few cans, jars or cartons of food or a monetary donation to the Clubhouse from 10:00 am until 1:00 pm. Chair of the event is Gladys Blank, NAAMAT.

This is the fourth year that Leisure World has participated in Good Deeds Day with donations to MANNA to feed the needy as its goal. Here in our region it is organized by the Jewish Federation of Greater Washington with support from a broad range of interfaith and social oriented organizations.

Technology Support will take place in the Computer Center and New Activities Room in Clubhouse II. This event is co-sponsored by the Jewish Residents of Leisure World and the Computer Learning Center. Students from the Jewish Day Schools will work one-on-one with seniors to cope with their smartphones, tablets, laptops, as well as the computers in the center. At the last Technology session in December, more than 60 seniors joined with the students to learn how to use or better use their equipment.

To enable the scheduling of students and seniors during the two sessions starting at 11:00 am and ending at 1:00 pm, residents are asked to sign up at the E&R office in Clubhouse II. Indicate on the sign-in sheet the technology you would like to learn and the session(s) you will be available.

Good Deeds Day is an annual celebration of doing good—where all around the world hundreds of thousands volunteer to help others, putting into practice the simple idea that every single person can do something good, be it large or small, to improve the lives of others and change the world.

On April 10 more than 8,000 locals are expected to join the international Jewish community in making a difference. Some will dance the day away with senior citizens, prepare and serve lunch to the homeless, help unite dogs with their former homes or help clean up a local park- all are projects that serve the best interests of the community.

### **PURIM IN A NUTSHELL**

The Persian empire of the 4th century BCE extended over 127 lands, and all the Jews were its subjects. When King Ahasuerus had his wife, Queen Vashti, executed for failing to follow his orders, he orchestrated a beauty pageant to find a new queen. A Jewish girl, Esther, found favor in his eyes and became the new queen—though she refused to divulge the identity of her nationality.

Meanwhile, the anti-Semitic Haman was appointed prime minister of the empire. Mordechai, the leader of the Jews (and Esther's cousin), defied the king's orders and refused to bow to Haman. Haman was incensed and convinced the king to issue a decree ordering the extermination of all the Jews on the 13th of Adar—a date chosen by a lottery Haman made (hence the name Purim, "lots").

Mordechai galvanized all the Jews, convincing them to repent, fast and pray to G-d. Meanwhile, Esther asked the king and Haman to join her for a feast. At the feast, Esther revealed to the king her Jewish identity. Haman was hanged, Mordechai was appointed prime minister in his stead, and a new decree was issued granting the Jews the right to defend themselves against their enemies.

#### **How We Celebrate**

On Purim, there are four mitzvahs we observe:

1. Hear the Megillah Head to your synagogue to hear the whole *megillah*. The *megillah*, a.k.a. "The Book of Esther," is the scroll that tells the Purim story. When Haman's name is mentioned you can twirl *graggers* (noisemakers) or stamp your feet to eradicate his evil name. Purim is the only time when it's a mitzvah to make noise!



2. Give to the Needy One of Purim's primary themes is Jewish unity. Haman tried to kill us all, we were all in danger together, so we celebrate together, too. Hence, on Purim day, we place special emphasis on caring for the less fortunate. Give money or food to needy people. On Purim, we give a to whoever asks; we don't verify his or her bank balance first.



3. Send Food Gifts to Friends On Purim, we emphasize the importance of friendship and community by sending gifts of food to friends.



4. Feast! During the course of Purim day, gather your family, maybe invite a guest or two, and celebrate with a festive Purim meal.

Masquerade! On Purim, children—and some adventurous adults, too—traditionally dress in costumes, an allusion to G-d's hand in the Purim miracle, which was disguised by natural events.


