## Shavuot / שבועות

The festival of Shavuot is a Jewish holiday that occurs on the sixth day of the Hebrew month of Sivan. Shavuot commemorates the anniversary of the day God gave the Torah to the entire Israelite nation assembled at Mount Sinai, although the association between the giving of the Torah and Shavuot is not explicit in the Biblical text. The holiday is one of the three Biblical pilgrimage festivals. It marks the conclusion of the Counting of the Omer.

We observe the holiday of Shavuot for two days. Yizkor is recited during services on the second day.

Traditionally, dairy foods are eaten on this holiday.

The March concert which had to be postponed due to the bad weather, has been rescheduled for Tuesday, June 25 at 2:00 pm in the Clubhouse II auditorium. In addition to renown musician Golda Vainberg-Tatz at the piano, the concert will also feature Cantor Kim Komrad, vocalist, and George Peachey. While Golda will perform classical selections on the piano, Cantor Komrad will sing Hebrew and

Yiddish melodies, accompanied by Peachey on the piano.

The concert is co-sponsored by the Jewish Residents of Leisure World and the Sunflower Project. Refreshments will be served after the concert. Admission is a \$10.00 donation, payable to JRLW. Tickets are available in the E&R office.

Golda Vainberg–Tatz has been described as "a pianist with wonderful firm, clear touch" by the New York Times. She has performed throughout Europe, Israel and U.S. and appeared on many radio and television broadcasts in Europe.

Hazzan Kim Komrad presently serves Kehilat Shalom Congregation in Gaithersburg, MD. She is the first female Hazzan to hold a pulpit in a Conservative Synagogue in the history of the Batimore-Washington area. In 2005 Komrad appeared with Hazzanim Sol Zim and Alberto Mizrahi for the International Cantorial Foundation, at the Center for the Performing Arts in Chicago.

Pianist George Peachey has enjoyed a varied career as a vocal and instrumental collaborative artist, and as soloist both in recital and with orchestra.

Critics have called him "an exemplary accompanist" who plays with "sensitive expertise."

The Sunflower Project, falls under the auspices of the Jewish Lithuanian Heritage Project, whose mission is to create rebridging between the Lithuanian and Jewish peoples, as there is a rich history that existed prior to 1941.

## What's Cooking in the Kitchen?

Rae Paley My daughter Joy's recipe

#### Description

Chicken and vegetables roasted with a rosemary, balsamic vinegar marinade.

#### Ingredients

- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1/3 cup balsamic vinegar
- 1 tablespoon dried rosemary
- 1/2 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts
- 1 green bell pepper, sliced
- 1 red bell pepper, sliced
- 1 small red onion, quartered
- 3 carrots, cut into 1 inch pieces
- 1 eggplant, cut into 1/2 inch cubes

#### Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Line a cookie sheet with aluminum foil, and coat with cooking spray.
- In a large bowl, combine olive oil, balsamic vinegar, rosemary, red pepper flakes, and garlic. Place chicken in the bowl, and marinate 5 minutes. Transfer to a baking dish, reserving marinade in the bowl.
- Place sliced green bell pepper, red bell pepper, red onion, carrots, and eggplant in the marinade, and toss to coat. Arrange in a single layer on the cookie sheet.
- 4. Place the chicken and vegetables in the preheated oven. Bake chicken for 20 minutes, or until juices run clear. Bake the vegetables for 35 minutes, or until the edges of the vegetables brown.
