WHAT'S WRONG WITH THIS PICTURE?

What is wrong with this picture? On erev Passover 2014 a man shot randomly at the Jewish Community Center in Overland Park, a suburb of Kansas City, and also at a Jewish Senior Citizen facility. Here is what I think is wrong with this picture. First, there was no picture either in our newspapers or on the television news of these incidents. If this shooting had taken place outside of a church, a Mosque or, God forbid, outside of an elementary school like Sandy Hook, the news would be splattered with photographs of the place and of people who had heard or who had seen the action.

Secondly, the story was buried in a small article on page 3 of the Washington Post. No biggie? I happened to see a news conference given by the officials in Overland Park. They were not sure whether or not this was a hate crime. Not sure? This man had been a former Grand Dragon of the KKK! He has a criminal record and is a known anti-Semite. He was a known Nazi sympathizer. And they weren't sure?

Where was the public outcry about the shootings? Why were the reporters silent for the most part? Where were the bouquets of flowers laid at the site of the shootings as we had seen in the other terrible events?

The Jewish Federation of Greater Washington and the Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater Washington issued the following statement:

"Our thoughts and prayers are with the families of the victims and the entire Greater Kansas City Jewish

Community after yesterday's horrific violence in Overland Park, Kansas. This was a senseless, cowardly attack, clearly motivated by hatred towards Jews which left three innocent people dead – including a grandfather and his grandson, both of whom were Christian.

We urge law enforcement authorities to prosecute the individual(s) responsible for this attack to the fullest extent of the law to send a message that violence, especially hatred-inspired violence, has no place in America."

Our Jewish Federation was spot-on in its evaluation of what had taken place in Overland Park. What will it take to make us wake up to the current spate of hate crimes? If this man had a criminal history, how come he had a gun?

As I sit here typing there is a memorial broadcast of the Boston Marathon incident on the television. Can't we hope for some of the same indignation and public sorrow when a Jewish Community Center is the object of a demented person's actions? Is a Jew a little less of a human being? Is a Jew's worth a little less than a non-Jew?

What is wrong with this picture?





The funeral was held Sunday, March 30, in King David Cemetery. Cantor Mike Kravitz, a long time friend of Irv, officiated.

Irv was the religious backbone of JRLW for many years before I arrived in LW in 2003. I have to tell you that through trying times he was always at my side, supporting me as we made changes to bring us back to a more observant Judaism. Irv had been the chairman of the Religious Committee for many years and was instrumental in providing JRLW members with services, Torah study sessions and a sense of being Jewish.

In his later years, housebound and isolated after the death of his wife, arrangements were made to have Rabbi Shmuel Leigh visit with Irv to discuss Torah and Talmud. Although he was a pharmacist by trade, I always envisioned Irv as wanting to be a Rabbi. This was confirmed by his son David. Irv enjoyed nothing as much as a lively discussion of the sedrah of the week or the interpretations described in the Talmud.

A favorite anecdote of what Irv was like took place with my first meeting with him in our apartment. His opening comment was, "Fred, I have a large ego; it's tough to be second fiddle." But that ego never stood in the way of helping him achieve things for the benefit of the members of JRLW.

He will be sorely missed by those of us who had the pleasure of his company.




