CANTOR'S CORNER

This year, Yom Haatzma'ut, Israeli Independence Day, will be celebrated on the 6th day of the Hebrew month of Iyar, 5777 which corresponds to May 2, 2017. Many of you remember learning "HATIKVAH" while you were still very young and think it has been the Israeli national anthem since 1948. But, "HATIKVAH" had a checkered history on its way to becoming the Israeli national anthem. Let's see how much you know about "HATIKVAH". I'll put all of you into JEOPARDY! once again with the following three answers. Cover the area directly after these answers to avoid cheating! Remember to put your responses in the form of a question.

- 1. "HATIKVAH" was first sung in Basel, Switzerland in 1897 at this international Jewish gathering.
- 2. One of the objections to "HATIKVAH" as a national anthem was that the melody bore a strong resemblance to the beginning of this composition by Czech composer Bedrich Smetana.
- 3. On the Gregorian calendar, "HATIKVAH" formally became the Israeli national anthem in this year.
- 1. What is the First Zionist Congress?
- 2. What is "The Moldau" (from "MA VLAST" ("My Country")?
- 3. What is 2004?

How many of you got all three? That's what I thought.

"HATIKVAH" actually began its life as part of a 9-stanza poem called "TIKVATENU" ("Our Hope"). It was written by a 19th century Hebrew poet named Naftali Hertz Imber who lived from 1856 to 1909. The poem was put to a melody adapted by Samuel Cohen from a Moldavian folk song called "Carul Cu Boi" which translates as "Cart and Oxen." "HATIKVAH" became popular among early Zionists, and it was sung at the First Zionist Congress. Not everyone liked it. One of the people who strongly objected to it was one Theodore Herzl who disliked it so much that he started several international competitions to come up with an alternative. None of those competitions provided a successful alternative. "HATIKVAH" took on additional criticism by some who felt that a melody similar to Smetana's "MOLDAU" should not be used. In addition, some religious Zionists complained that there was no mention of the name of God in the text. Rabbi Abraham Isaac Kook, the great Hebrew scholar, wrote a poem called "Ha-Emunah" ("the Faith)" which he hoped would be used for a national anthem's text. His poem includes a line of which the English translation is "the steadfast faith in the return to our holy land...where we shall serve our God." Still another proposed text for a national anthem was Hayim Nahman Bialik's poem "Birkat Ha-Am" ("The People's Blessing") in which a translated line includes "Strengthen the hands of our brothers renewing the soil of our land." So, there was much objection to "HATIKVAH" from many sources over many years.

Yet, despite the protests, "HATIKVAH" continued to be popular. In 1933 at the 18th Zionist Congress' convention, "HATIKVAH" was adopted as the Zionist movement's anthem. In 1948, while "HATIKVAH" wasn't officially named the State of Israel's national anthem, it was performed at all State functions. 56 years later, "HATIKVAH" officially became the national anthem of the State of Israel. In its final form, "HATIKVAH" has 2 stanzas which capture the Jew's desire to return to an ancient homeland. Here is a translation of the powerful Hebrew words of "HATIKVAH."

As long as the Jewish spirit yearns deep in the heart with eyes turned eastward looking toward Zion, our hope is not yet lost. The hope of 2000 years, to be a free people in our land, the land of Zion and Jerusalem.

Quite a story, no?

A joyous Yom Haatzma'ut to you all.

Who led the early American Zionist movement before becoming a Supreme Court Justice?

Louis Brandeis became the first American Jewish leader to embrace Zionism. Working to resolve garment industry problems, he interacted with several European Zionists and learned to appreciate the problems worldly Jews had. He induced prominent and wealthy Jews to support Zionism. He recruited Rabbi Stephen S. Wise to join him as powerful leaders of the American Zionist movement. Brandeis bowed out after being appointed a U.S. Supreme Court Justice. Brandeis's motto was "To be good Americans, we must be better Jews, and to be better Jews, we must become Zionist."

RECIPE CORNER

BLINTZ SOUFFLE

May means Shavuot. Shavuot means a dairy dish. This recipe for Blintz Souffle is easy and delicious. We printed this recipe several years ago. We have been asked to reprint it.

Ingredients

- 2 pkgs of frozen cheese or cherry blintzes defrosted
- 1/4 lb butter or margarine
- 4 eggs well beaten or an 8 oz package of Eggbeaters
- 1½ cup sour cream or light sour cream.
- pinch salt
- 1 tsp vanilla
- ¼ cup sugar

Spray bottom of a 2 quart casserole dish with vegetable spray. Place blintzes with fold side down in one layer. Melt margarine and blend with all ingredients. Pour over blintzes. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes. (I alternate cherry and cheese blintzes when laying out the blintzes.)

BROOKE GROVE OPEN HOUSE FOR NEW REHAB CENTER

Members of JRLW are invited to attend an open house Thursday, May 25, from 2:00 to 5:00 pm, celebrating the opening of the new Brooke Grove Rehabilitation and Nursing Center (BGRNC).

The facility is a new state-of-the-art addition to Brooke Grove. This wing will add 77,000 square feet to BGRNC's existing 83,000 square feet and will increase capacity to 190 beds, with 70 beds dedicated solely to rehabilitation. Equipment and technology upgrades will ultimately optimize the rehabilitation potential of those in BGRNC's care. The first phase of the project is slated to open in 2017.

The open house will include a tour of the Rehab Center and two-story therapy room.

My mom used to cut chicken, chop eggs and peel onions on the same cutting board with the same knife and no bleach or antibacterial wipes, but we didn't seem to get food poisoning.

Our school sandwiches were wrapped in wax paper or in a baggie with a twist tie, in a brown paper bag, not in ice pack coolers, but I can't remember getting e.Coli.

Almost all of us would rather have gone swimming in the lake or at the beach instead of a pristine pool (talk about boring); no beach closures then.

We all took gym class... and risked permanent injury with a pair of regular old tennis shoes, if we were lucky, from a department store, but likely hand-me- downs instead of having crosstraining athletic shoes with air cushion soles and built in light reflectors that cost as much as a small car. I can't recall any injuries but they must have happened because they tell us how much safer we are now.

We got a spanking for doing something wrong. Parents called it discipline. And we all grew up to accept the rules and to honor and respect our parents, grandparents, teachers, police officers, and all of those older than us.

We had 50 kids or so in our class and we all learned to read, write, do math and spell almost all the words needed to write a grammatically correct letter. Even in cursive!

We all said prayers in school, irrespective of our religion, and sang our national anthem and no one got upset. We stayed in detention after school. We caught all sorts of negative attention we wish we hadn't got. It was shameful and detention was nothing compared to what was waiting at home.

I just can't recall ever being bored, even though we were without computers, Play Station, Nintendo, X-box, laptops, cell phones or 270 digital TV cable stations. We went outside and played with the neighbor kids of all ages, made up games, and rode our bikes for miles. Oh yeah, and where were the antibiotics and medical kit when I scraped something or got that bee sting? I could have been killed! We played "King of the Hill" on piles of gravel left on vacant building sites and when we got hurt, mom pulled out the bottle of iodine or red Mercurochrome and then we got our backside spanked. Now it's a trip to the emergency room, followed by a 10-day dose of antibiotics.

To top it off, not a single person I knew had ever been told that they were from a dysfunctional family. How could we possibly have known that? We never needed to get into group therapy and/ or anger management classes.

We were obviously so duped by so many societal ills that we didn't even notice that the entire country wasn't taking Prozac!
How did we ever survive?






