RECIPE CORNER

BRISKETS, BRISKETS, BRISKETS!!

Here they are. Brisket recipes from our members. Some sound familiar, some are new. You might want to try one for Chanukah! Thanks to all the contributors.

A VERY EASY BRISKET RECIPE THAT EVERYONE LOVES:

Mix 1 can of Rokeach tomato and mushroom sauce with 1 package of Lipton Onion soup mix. Place Brisket (3-5 lbs.) in roasting pan. Spread sauce over top of meat. Cover pan with aluminum foil. Roast in 350 degree oven for 2 1/2 hours or until tender. Let cool, and slice across the grain.

DOLLY'S BRISKET

3-pound brisket
Onion soup mix
Vegetable soup mix
2 cans whole small potatoes, drained
Pepper and Worchester sauce to taste

Boil soup mixes together with 1/2 liquid called for. Pour this over meat before putting it in the oven. Cover tightly with foil. Cook for 4 hours at 325 degrees. Add potatoes and recover. Cook another hour. When cold, slice and reheat in the gravy.

MAMA'S BRISKET

One brisket (Cut off large areas of fat, leaving a small amount for taste.)
20 whole peppercorns
12 bay leaves, broken up
Two sixteen ounce cans of tomatoe sauce
8 tablespoons of brown sugar
Preheat the oven to 350.

In the bottom of your elongated pan, pour one can of tomato sauce. Add 4 tablespoons of brown sugar. Add 6 broken bay leaves. Add ten whole peppercorns. Stir mixture to dissolve sugar and distribute flavoring. Next lay the brisket on the mixture. Then cover the brisket with the same ingredients as you used on the bottom. Cover the whole thing with aluminum foil and place in oven. Bake for about 2 1/2 hours, depending on the size of your brisket. Slice thin to serve. There will be plenty of delicious gravy from the sauce. When serving, heat sauce and pour over meat.

ADELE'S BRISKET

4 to 5 lb brisket (or larger if you prefer)
1 can whole berry cranberry sauce
1 cup brewed coffee
1 packet onion soup mix
1 large onion (sliced)
1 large cooking bag
sliced carrots, celery and potatoes (optional)

Put sliced onions on bottom of floured cooking bag. Season brisket with any of your favorite seasonings and place in bag on top of the onions. Pour onion soup mix on top of meat. Mix brewed coffee with the cranberry sauce in separate bowl and pour over brisket. Add potatoes, carrots and celery if desired and place around the brisket. Close bag and place in roasting pan (in case of drips). Don't forget to cut 6 slits in bag to let steam escape. Follow directions inside cooking bag box for correct timing. A 4 to 5 lb brisket should cook for 2 1/2 to 3 hours at 325 degrees. I got this recipe from my long time friend Adele. It's an easy preparation, easy clean up and delicious flavor.

BRISKET

1 brisket, approx. 3 - 4 pounds
 1 can tomato sauce
 1/3 cup ketchup
 1/3 cup brown sugar
 3 onions, thinly sliced
 3 tbsps vinegar
 1/2 can of beer
 1 package small, peeled carrots

Sautee onions. Spread bottom of rectangular pan with most of the sliced onions. Place meat on the onions. Mix tomato sauce, ketchup, beer, vinegar and brown sugar together and spread over meat. Top with rest of the sliced onions and the carrots. Cover tightly with foil. Cook in 325 degree oven for 3 hours. Cool meat before slicing. Put meat back in pan with the gravy and refrigerate overnight.

NANNY'S BRISKET

1 large brisket – 7 lbs (or 2 3 1/2 lb briskets),
 3 large yellow onions,
 2 12-oz bottles chili sauce,
 1 pkg beef/onion soup mix,
 1 1/2 cup red wine.

Slice onions, put in bottom of pan. Place meat, fat side down, in pan over onions. Spread chili sauce over meat. Sprinkle with soup mix. Pour wine over meat. Place on top rack of 350 degree oven. Wrap tightly with foil. Unwrap and base every hour. Remove from oven and cool. Place brisket in refrigerator. Save drippings and onions in separate container. Refrigerate. Next day, slice meat thinly and reheat with the defatted drippings and onions in 325 degree oven.
