CANTOR'S CORNER 7

At the end of August, Cheryl and I got the chance to see an artist we had wanted to see live and in person – Kristin Chenoweth. Kristin was performing at Wolf Trap, and given the fact that Cheryl and I had our first date at a Wolf Trap concert, it was a pleasure to return. Kristin Chenoweth was Glinda in the original cast of WICKED and has appeared countless times on television and on stage, but our seeing her live was an incredible experience, so much so that when tickets became available for her return to the area in 2016, we were among the first to get them. She sang magnificently over a wide range of repertoire, but at one point she paused to talk about her “favorite composer” and sang one of his songs, a song she said “has been called the greatest song ever written” and is titled “All the Things You Are.” While I was very familiar with much of this composer’s music, I decided to look him up. I’m including this column in the November JRLW newsletter because on the 11th of this month we will observe the 70th Gregorian calendar yearzeit of this great American composer who was only 60 at the time of his passing.

He was born in New York City in 1885, the son of an immigrant German-Jewish father and an American-born Jewish mother. He attended middle class public schools and his first music teacher was his mother. He would eventually enroll at the New York College of Music and would continue his music studies in Heidelberg, Germany. When he returned to New York, he worked as a rehearsal pianist as well as a publisher’s pianist and then started contributing songs to various musical shows. Some of his earliest songs included “They Didn’t Believe Me” and “Look for the Silver Lining.” However, in 1927 he would team with a young lyricist named Oscar Hammerstein II to work on an adaptation of an Edna Ferber novel named SHOW BOAT. That musical would introduce classic songs such as “Can’t Help Lovin’ Dat Man,” “Make Believe,” “Bill”

and a song with which Dorothy Hammerstein, Oscar’s wife, bristled when she heard a remark that this composer was credited for writing it. “Indeed not,” she said. “My husband wrote ‘OL’ MAN RIVER.’” (The composer) wrote ‘DUM DUM DUM DUM!’”

This composer would go on to work in Hollywood as well as Broadway. Some of the other songs he wrote include “Smoke Gets in Your Eyes,” “Yesterdays,” “The Way You Look Tonight” and, of course, “All the Things You Are.”

I’m sure many of you have figured out that this composer is JEROME KERN, but if you haven’t, now you know.

For those of you with Internet access who would like to see Kristin Chenoweth perform “All the Things You Are,” type in “Kristin Chenoweth All the Things You Are” and you will have a choice of youtube videos.

KRISTALLNACHT OBSERVANCE

JRLW will observe the 77th Anniversary of Kristallnacht on Sunday, November 8, 2015, at 7:30 pm in the Activities Room of Clubhouse II.

Our speaker will be Eric Rozenman, Region Director for CAMERA. CAMERA is the name of the organization more formally entitled Committee for Accuracy in Middle East Reporting in America.

People ask, “**What is Kristallnacht?**” Translated into English, it means Crystal Night. Others refer to this horrific night as the Night of Broken Glass. Here is how it came about.

In November 1938, a 17-year-old Jew, named Herschel Grynszpan, living in Paris, received news that his family had been deported from their home in Germany to the Polish border. There they were they were stranded and mistreated. An enraged Herschel went to the German Embassy and shot a diplomat named Ernst Von Rath. On November 9, Von Rath died. The Nazi propaganda chief, Josef Goebbels, saw the killing as an opportunity to take the persecution of the Jews to another level. With Hitler’s assent, Goebbels called for actions against Jews to express the anger of the German people. Within hours, Nazi Stormtroopers were rampaging through almost every town and village in Germany and Austria. Synagogues were desecrated and many were set afire by the Nazis. Jewish businesses and homes were broken into and were plundered. Most Jewish males were arrested and sent to concentration camps. Some were killed. Because broken glass was everywhere, the term “Night of Broken Glass” was coined.

With this action, the Jews realized that there was no more future for them in Germany. Many refer to this as the beginning of the Holocaust.

This program is sponsored by Jewish Residents of Leisure World and is free of charge. All Leisure World residents are invited to attend.

Dr. Withers’ story is a heartwarming one. He could be considered as one of the “righteous” ones. Come to hear the story and bring your friends.
