What's Cooking in the Kitchen?

Honey Cake

Ingredients

4 eggs
 1 cup sugar
 ½ cup oil
 1 lb jar honey
 4 cups flour
 2 tsp baking soda
 2 tsp baking powder
 2 tsp nutmeg
 2 tsp cinnamon
 1 cup strong tea
 ½ cup raisins and/or ½ cup chopped walnuts

Step 1: Cream eggs and of sugar

Step 2: Add cup oil and honey (which has been standing in hot water 'til warm)

Step 3: Sift and add cups flour, baking soda, baking powder, nutmeg, and cinnamon

Step 4: Add dry ingredients alternately with one cup strong tea which has been cooled

Step 5: Add raisins and/or walnuts Pour into slightly oiled pans. Use 2 regular sized loaf pans or 3 small loaf pans. Bake at 325 degrees for about one hour.
