20 DAYS AND 2,000 ROCKETS—AND NOBODY SAID A WORD

The following is taken from an article written by Maryana Harouni, Director of Education at B'nai Shalom of Olney Synagogue:

We were doing Havdalah on the balcony. There was a pleasant breeze which would be welcomed with a smile on any other summer day in Israel, but nobody said a word. Then, we heard the siren. We ran to the shelter, heard the explosion, waited ten minutes, then came back and continued the singing. And nobody said a word. That sums up my visit to Israel this summer.

I traveled to Israel this summer to attend an educators' seminar. The day I arrived, amidst the excitement of seeing my family, we heard the horrific news that three teenagers who were kidnapped by Hamas terrorists were found dead – shot. We watched the news and nobody said a word. I contacted my friend who volunteered to accompany the Frenkel family throughout this ordeal, to see how he was coping with the news, but he did not say a word. And that set the mood for the next 20 days in Israel.

The next day I joined my colleagues in the seminar. We studied and travelled in Israel. Then the rockets started. One hundred rockets a day, every day, rained on the skies of Israel. But nobody said a word. We saw tanks on the roads. We saw soldiers. We heard the news. But nobody said a word.

My sister picked up her grandchild from kindergarten and brought him home because they could not move all the children to the shelter in 30 seconds. But nobody said a word.

We went to deliver food and sweets for Shabbat to the soldiers at the Iron Dome. It was hot in the Judean desert and they were in full gear. They smiled to thank us. But nobody said a word.

We saw the helicopters circling the neighborhood for hours. There was concern that the terrorists infiltrated the area. We looked at the helicopters and waited. "Are you scared?" they asked me. "No," I said. And nobody said a word.

We watched the terrorists infiltrate a kibbutz with the intention of mass slaughter. We could see

their faces on the TV screen, their guns and their explosives. But nobody said a word.

We saw the terrorists crawl out of a tunnel in a kibbutz to massacre the children. "Are you scared?" I asked my sister. "No," she said calmly, "I am terrified." And she continued cooking for Shabbat. And nobody said a word.

We saw the rockets in the sky before the sirens sounded. We grabbed the baby out of his bed and ran to the shelter. He woke up startled and crying because the pacifier fell on the way. But nobody said a word.

The siren rang when we were driving. We stopped the car, moved away and lay on the ground, covering our heads. We heard the explosion and it was over and we continued driving. And nobody said a word.

My cousin got a phone call from her 19-year old son. "I am calling to let you know that they are taking our phones. There will not be any contact for a while because we are entering Gaza. Lehitraot, Ima (I will see you later, mom) Don't worry. I will be fine." She hung up the phone. She was hitting the table with her fist. She bellowed a loud cry. But nobody said a word. She had said it all. But the world did not say a word.

My heroes this year are the Israelis. Throughout the 20 days in Israel and through the 2000 rockets that rained on them, they were determined to continue living and loving, producing and celebrating. The sirens and the rockets were a significant part of their daily lives, but after each rocket, they picked themselves up and continued working, living, innovating, shopping and learning. They have developed an admirable resilience and a brave determination to live life to the fullest and build the best country in the world despite the danger, despite the death, despite the rockets, despite the terror. Their optimism and their restraint, their strength and their resilience, and most of all their courage, make them, each one of them, the children, the soldiers, the leaders and the mothers, my heroes.

May this be a year of peace. Just peace.

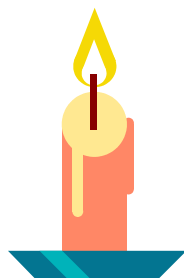

SHABBOS CANDLES....Why Bother?

I light Shabbos Candles. From the time I was first married, I have lit the Shabbos candles. While our children were growing up they knew that Friday evening meant Shabbos dinner and lighting the Shabbos candles. When they were grown and married the grandchildren knew that if they spent Friday night at our house there would be a Shabbos dinner and that Grandma would light the Shabbos candles. That was a given.

Now, I live alone. On Friday evening, I light the Shabbos candles. Some friends ask me why I continue to do this. There is no one in the apartment besides me; no one to see or hear me. In my heart, I believe differently. I believe that Someone does. After I say the brucha and light the candles, I pray to HaShem to look out for my family and keep them safe. Now, I also pray that He bless Israel and the brave men and women who protect her. I even sing "Shabbat Shalom," although no one is in the apartment besides me.

Maybe it's tradition. My grandmother lit the Shabbos candles; my mother lit the Shabbos candles and I light them. But, it's more than that.

There is another important reason to light the Shabbos candles. Today, when there are so many incidents of anti-Semitism going on around the world, even on the streets of our own New York City where a couple was attacked and beaten just because the man was wearing a yamaku, should we continue to show our Jewishness? I say yes! Hell yes! I feel an obligation to those Jews who are afraid or not able to light the Shabbos candles to do it for them. I feel an obligation to the six million Jews killed in concentration camps who were not able to observe the Sabbath. I light the Shabbos candles for those who can't.

And lastly and most importantly, I light the Shabbos candles on Friday evening because I am Jewish; and **that is what we Jews do on Friday evening.**

RECIPE CORNER

APPLE CAKE FOR A SWEET NEW YEAR

2 cups peeled apples, thinly sliced
5 tablespoons white sugar
2 tablespoons ground cinnamon

1 cup vegetable oil
2 cups white sugar
4 eggs
3 teaspoons vanilla extract
¼ cup orange juice

3 cups flour
1 tablespoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt

1/3 cup orange juice
2/3 cup confectioner's sugar

Preheat oven to 325 °. Grease and flour 9 inch tube pan.

Mix first 3 ingredients in bowl and set aside. Beat oil and 2 cups of sugar with electric mixer in large bowl. Add eggs, one at a time, blending into sugar mixture. Add vanilla and ¼ cup orange juice. Combine flour, baking powder and salt in small bowl and stir into sugar mixture. Pour ½ of the batter into the prepared tube pan. Layer apple mixture on top. Pour remaining batter over apples.

Bake in oven about 1¼ hours or until toothpick inserted in the cake comes out clean. Do not overbake. Allow cake to cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan.

Mix orange juice and confectioner's sugar together and drizzle over warm cake.

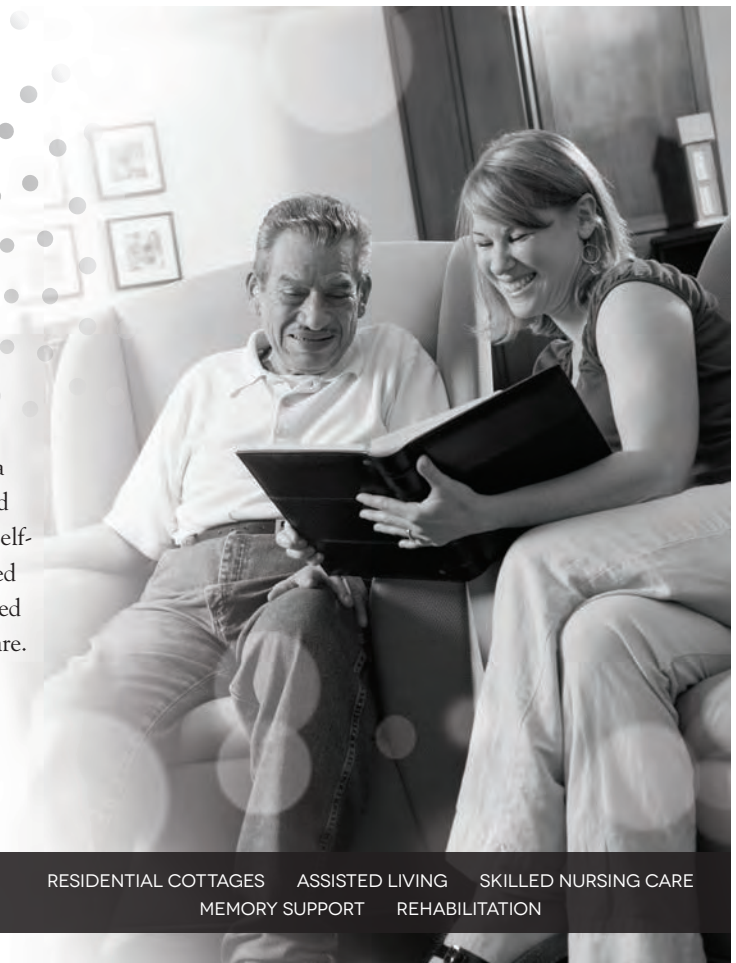
