CANTOR'S CORNER

If you are of a certain age, you know this line from a song "You can get anything you want at Alice's Restaurant." The song was a major hit for Arlo Guthrie - Woody's son - in 1967. By the way, you may not know that while Woody Guthrie was not Jewish, his second wife Marjorie (Arlo's mother) was, and in 1960 Arlo, under the tutelage of Rabbi Meir Kehane, celebrated his bar mitzvah. Obviously, at the time of Arlo's "Alice's Restaurant" hit, technology wasn't nearly what it is today. I think that for people in the year 2017, it might be more accurate to say "You can get anything you want - on the INTERNET!" You want an item from Amazon? No problem. Once you've given them your credit card information, you go on your computer, tell them the item you want, specify the shipping you want and sit back and wait for the item to arrive at your door. What could be easier?

I quess I'm a little old-fashioned-- I don't necessarily like the easy way out. Call it the thrill of the hunt. I have always enjoyed going out to look for things I need because I never know exactly what I'll find, and it is so satisfying when those efforts pay off. That's one of the reasons I still frequent used-record stores, thrift shops and garage and community sales looking for records, CDs and reel-to-reel tapes. Sometimes the efforts yield nothing, but sometimes I hit the mother lode. As I started writing this column back in August, I was reminded of the second congregation I served as cantor back in the early 1970s. It was called the Olney Jewish Congregation (now B'nai Shalom of Olney), and it met at the old Montgomery General Hospital. When I was hired to conduct High Holy Day services in 1973, the understanding was that I would conduct the services mostly by myself with some help from congregants. No rabbi! I knew I'd need help for sermons and stories about the holidays to use during services, so I went to Herb Goodman of Goodman's Hebrew Books whom I'd first met in the late '60s when the store was on Georgia Avenue in the District, a store that would later move to the strip mall on University Boulevard right beside where Shalom Kosher supermarket used to be. Herb introduced me to a number of anthologies on the Jewish holidays that were edited by Rabbi Philip Goodman (no relation). I

bought them all, and these books have been invaluable to me over the decades to come. Even though I regularly use the internet to find things about Judaism, I still peruse these books every year as the various Jewish holidays come close. And as I did that again this year, in the book THE SUKKOT AND SIMHAT TORAH ANTHOLOGY, I found a poem I'd like to share with you.

I had first encountered a poet named Philip Raskin in a book called SABBATH:THE DAY OF DELIGHT that was edited by Rabbi Abraham Milgram. Raskin wrote a poem called KINDLING THE SABBATH LIGHT that I have used many times over the years at Friday evening services, some of which have been at Leisure World. Rabbi Goodman's Sukkot/Simchat Torah anthology included another Raskin poem called "The Etrog." Given the fact that Erev Sukkot is on October 4, the timing could not be better. Watch how vividly this 1925 poem still captures what an etrog can mean to people.

The Day of Atonement is over; My father an etrog has bought

And never the eyes of a lover did sparkle as his when he brought

And showed us the fruit that was shining with sheen of a tropical star,

The fruit for which hearts are still pining from homeland long exiled and far.

And never was valued a jewel as dear as the fruit was to him-

A value the centuries cruel could neither efface nor bedim.

I looked at the etrog the golden, and dreamt of the orchards of gold,

I dreamt of the ages the olden, that never in hearts will grow old.

I dreamt of the rills and the fountains that watered these gardens of yore,

The plains and the vales and the mountains that blossomless, blossom the more...

I looked at my father caressing the fruit that bejeweled his feast

And mutely my heart sent a blessing To Zion – the Queen of the East.

Let me wish you all a joyous Sukkot and Simchat Torah.



How did Jews support the development of the NAACP movement?

In 1909, a small group of Jews helped establish the NAACP. Rabbi Stephen S. Wise was a leading fundraiser. Lawyer Joel Spingarn served as an effective chairman for the next 10 years. He worked with black leader W.E.B. DuBois to make the NAACP the most forceful organization for black civil rights at that time. He got the U.S. Army to establish a separate training camp for World War I black soldiers so they would have better opportunities to get commissions. His brother, Arthur Spingarn, was the NAACP legal counsel for many years and was president when the NAACP won the landmark Supreme Court case outlawing school segregation in 1954. Industrialist Kivie Kaplan was the NAACP president for over 10 years.

BEER BREAD

Here is a simple recipe for delicious homemade bread. Only 3 ingredients!

3 cups self-rising flour (sifted)

3 tbsp sugar

1(12 ounce) can beer

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Mix dry ingredients and beer.

Pour into a greased loaf pan.

Bake 45 minutes, remove from pan and cool on rack for at least 15 minutes.

(Note: if you do not have self-rising flour, you may substitute regular flour. To 1 cup of flour, add 1 ½ tsp baking powder and ½ tsp salt.)




