RECIPE CORNER



ZUCCHINI BREAD Sue Rudo

2 loaf pans, greased and floured

3 eggs

1 c applesauce

2 T veg oil

1 c brown sugar

½ c sugar

1/4 tsp baking powder

2 tsp baking soda

2 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp salt

2 tsps vanilla

2 cup flour

1 cop chopped nuts

1 cup choco chips

2 cups shredded raw zucchini

Preheat oven to 350°

Shred zucchini and place in strainer and press to get as much liquid out as possible.

Beat eggs, sugars, oil and applesauce together by hand. Add flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, salt, vanilla, nuts and chips. Mix together by hand. Add zucchini – minus liquid. Pour into prepared pans. Bake for one hour. These loaves freeze well.

B'nai B'rith was founded October 13, 1843 in New York City by Henry Jones and 11 other German Jewish immigrants. The first meeting took place in Sinsheimer's cafe on the Lower East Side. Its original purpose was to help new immigrants. It soon created its first humanitarian relief project, an insurance policy for widows and orphans of deceased members. In 1851, B'nai B'rith protested to the U.S. Secretary of State and U.S. Senators about the Swiss prohibiting Jews from settling in certain Swiss cantons. This initial advocacy on behalf of human rights for the Jewish people led to B'nai B'rith becoming the global voice of the world's Jewish community.

B'nai B'rith now has a broad program of Jewish advocacy including a Center for Human Rights and Public Policy, a

Center for Senior Services, a Center for Community Action and Jewish Identity, a Center for Jewish Culture and a

World Center in Jerusalem focusing on Israel and its place in the world. B'nai B'rith also supports Jewish continuity and young leaders with its Perlman Camp in Pennsylvania and the Beber Camp in Wisconsin.

B'nai B'rith remains a national and global leader in the fight against antisemitism and anti-Israel bias. Its senior housing program includes our local Homecrest House. The Mission Office includes an annual program for Jews to come to Cuba to provide needed medicines and meet with the Jewish community in Cuba. PHYLLYS' CORNER

THE GUTTA BAYTA

For years I have known about a "gutta bayta". These words were mostly mouthed by my mother or elderly relatives when someone had died. They would say, "Zeit a gutta bayta", for the children or some other loved one still living. Of course, some may say "GITTA bayta", depending on their background, but "kugel", "keegel", it's all noodles. I was never really sure of what magic was expected of this "gutta bayta" (literally meaning good intercessor) or how the recently deceased person could do *anything* at all, once he or she had passed.

Still, it was assumed that the dead have powers -- an ancient and popular belief amongst our people-- and who am I to argue? I recall after their father's funeral telling my children, "Now Daddy will keep an eye on you -- watch over you." So, deep down in my heart of hearts, I really buy the whole premise.

Now, to digress (in order to later tie up my message). Last week I happened upon an obituary on Facebook. It was that of a former serious beau, one whom I had not seen or heard from in 60 years. What a bummer! Even though we had gone in different directions, just seeing his name in print recalled tender moments together and screaming sessions with my family (mostly my mother) urging me to end the relationship, he was lazy, would never amount to anything, had no ambition, was not good enough for me, etc. It was safer to believe those words. Why was I so unnerved now? Was it mere coincidence that I stumbled upon this information after all this time? Had my late friend been forever doomed to follow their predictions?

The obituary stated otherwise. He had become an economist, a professor, with a doctorate and many acknowledgments and honors, led an exemplary life, both in social, civic and religious arenas. Now, decades later, I find myself being proud of him. And angry. My family should have traded in their crystal ball. It needed a tune-up.

To return to my original story, there is a young person in my family who, for the past year or so, is serious with someone that I am not personally thrilled about. I have offered my opinion time and again, knowing it is not my business but is a concern. In short, I have been rather difficult when the subject arises in our family circles. My feeling is: the relationship should end, this person lacks ambition, is lazy, is not good enough and will never amount to anything.

Sound familiar?

Back to the gutta bayta. Some may call it a spirit guide; some, a guardian angel, some may simply dismiss certain occurrences as happenstance or coincidence, I do not believe such a thing as coincidence exists. I don't say YOU have to believe it, but I think everything happens for a reason: the song you claimed as your own coming over the radio at just the time when you were lost in memories of the one who shared it; a special date on the calendar which catches your eye; a license plate of the car ahead of you which spells out a familiar birth date.......but you must be able to recognize the signs. And learn from them.

I think whoever or whatever is "keeping an eye" on me, is telling me, "Lighten up, mortal, your crystal ball needs an overhaul. Give a kid a break, like you would have wanted."

SUKKAH CELEBRATION AT INTERFAITH CHAPEL

The Jewish Residents of Leisure World invite residents of Leisure World and members of the Interfaith Chapel to join with its members in the celebration of the holiday Sukkoth. The erection of the Sukkah is an annual event on the grounds of the Interfaith Chapel. The Sunday of the holiday, this year September 26th, is open house for the community from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

The Sukkah will be open daily from September 27 to 29 from 2:00 to 4:00 PM. Maariv services will be conducted in the Sukkah Wednesday and Thursday nights, Sept. 22 and 23, at 7:00 PM. The Sukkah will be manned by a committee of JRLW members, as well as representatives from other Jewish organizations in Leisure World.

Sukkoth is one of the agricultural holidays of the Jewish calendar, mandated in the Torah (Bible) together with Passover and Shavuot. It follows closely on the heels of the High Holidays – Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur and is a constant reminder of the passage of the Israelites through the desert after leaving bondage in Egypt.

The Sukkah is built to remind Jews of the structures used by the Israelites as they moved through the desert during the forty years of transit from Egypt to the Promised Land. The roof is not solid; it is made of rods and twigs and leaves, so that the sun and the moon may shine through to the dwelling area. To this day, Jews around the world erect Sukkahs to commemorate the holiday and observe its rituals. You will find them on the grounds as well as on balconies in apartment houses.

One of the rituals is the eating of meals in the Sukkah with appropriate blessings. In Leisure World JRLW follows this custom by providing snacks and drinks for the visitors. It is a

blessings to sit down in the Sukkah, recite the blessings for the food and then have that bite to eat and a glass to drink. A glass of wine or grape juice, a wafer or cookie and the blessings make for a pleasant reminder of the hardships encountered by the Israelites as they struggled to survive in the barren desert and mountains outside of Israel. How sweet is was when they passed into the Promised Land and found the land of milk and honey.
