Religious Committee Notes

The Religious Committee has now completed their work on revising the schedule of High Holiday services to conform to the new Machzor we will be using for the first time this year.

Most of the changes from the old Silverman Machzor will be rather modest, however, the new Harlow Machzor does make changes in language, it provides for alternative readings to include references to the Matriarchs as well as Patriarchs. In particular the Machzor provides an alternative to the traditional Torah reading during Mincha on Yom Kippur. This has engendered a lively discussion of the pros and cons in the Religious Committee and this discussion will continue in the months to come. I will not go into this discussion at this time because Rabbi Fink will have a lot to say about this issue during the High Holidays. For those who are interested please make every effort to attend the services and I guarantee you that you will find it worthwhile.

The High Holidays this year will start with evening services at Erev Rosh Hashana on Wednesday, September 28 at 7:00 in Clubhouse II for the Conservative Services and in the Interfaith Chapel for the Reform Services.

Yom Kippur will begin with the Kol Nidre service Friday, October 7 at 6:40 pm again in the Activities Room of Clubhouse II for the conservative Service and in the Interfaith Chapel for the Reform Service.

Yiskor services will be held on Saturday, October 8 at approximately 11:30 am and all are welcome. Attendance at other services requires a ticket and ushers will be at the doors to verify that entrance to services is by ticket only.

Break the fast on Saturday, October 8 will begin at the conclusion of the Conservative

Services at approximately 7:10 pm in Clubhouse I in the Crystal Ballroom.

The Sukkot holiday starts on Wednesday, October 12 and continues until Friday, October 21 with Simchat Torah. Our Sukkah will be erected on the grounds of the Interfaith Chapel and the Sukkah will be open all day, with a short service at 7:00 pm except on Thursday when we will have a regular service in the Activities room of clubhouse II.

On Thursday, October 20 we will be observing Shmini Atzeret in the Activities Room of Clubhouse II where Yiskor will be recited at approximately 11:30 am. All are welcome at the services.

SEPTEMBER RELIGIOUS SERVICES

The next Friday evening Service is September 2 at 8 PM in the Inter-Faith Chapel. Rabbi Gary Fink will officiate with the participation of Cantor Emeritus Mark Levi. Ed Laskin will lead the choir.

The next Saturday morning services will be held on September 10 at 9:15 in Clubhouse II in the Activities Room. Cantor Michael Kravitz will conduct the services with Justin Kramer leading the preliminary service. Cantor Kravitz will conduct the Torah service (Kee Tetze; Deuteronomy 21:10-25:1). Haftorah will be chanted by Jerry Miller and a D'var Torah will also be delivered by Jerry. Shacharit will be led by Cantor Kravitz.

Rosh Hashanah Services will be held on Wednesday evening, September 28, and on Thursday and Friday mornings .



THE MEMORIAL CANDLE

Yesterday was my late husband's yahrzeit. I lit the candle the evening before and it glowed brightly for well over 24 hours. This morning, upon entering the kitchen, there it was, sitting on the stove, never flickering, steadily burning. I looked at it and said, "Keep going, Paul. Hang in there."

In the early afternoon I went into the kitchen again, and the glass was dark, no glimmer of light providing its immediate surroundings with that soft, familiar glow that had so recently occupied it. I made sure the flame was quite dead, and matter-of-factly tossed the used shell into the trash. And then the thought struck me! The memorial candle is much like life itself. After the light was gone, the glass container appeared gray and cold. The spirit, the soul no longer dwelled within it. We shine in this world for all too short a time, and while we are here we can illuminate the lives of those around us with the light we give. Then, all too soon, the light is gone and all that remains is the empty shell, the glass no longer of any use.

Energy, it is said, cannot be destroyed. It goes on, transforms, spreads its glow in another place. Even without a physical presence, it remains steadfast in our minds, thoughts and hearts. This is the light which will never expire.

I sometimes think that the much discussed light that people claim to see in near-death experiences might be a compilation of all of the bright souls

which have gone before us down through history, the outer shells gone.....the inner spirits set free. One day we will know. One day the pieces will fall into place. For now, the memories are real, the connection is unbroken and somewhere the candle still glows.

THIS YEAR IN JERUSELAM

Madeline and I went to Israel this summer. A major reason was to watch our grandson participate for the JCCGW in the JCC Maccabbi Games basketball tournament. It has been some time since we last visited Israel, so the experience was overwhelming in many ways.

The initial experience was touring right on the borders of Lebanon, Syria and Jordan. At one point, we could see the sea to the west.

In the northern sector, we rode on roads next to the fences and the dirt roads that the Israel patrols use. The opening ceremonies were in Kiriyaat Shmone, nestled in between the borders of the two Arab neighbors to the north. We stayed at Kfar Blum which stands below the heights of the mountains of Syria.

On the positive side were the vibrant communities that we visited in Israel-- the northern Galilee, Jerusalem and Tel Aviv. Active and happy people moved through the streets, in the malls and restaurants, as well as in the museums and archeological sites. We saw the latest including a kosher Mac Donalds and the ancient ruins of the City of David in Jerusalem, the ruins of Roman cities in Beit Se'an and Caesarea, an ancient synagogue in Baram and the Crusader city of Akko (Acre). Yad Vashem expanded and was a vivid reminder of why an Israel must exist as a Jewish state.

Best of all was the sight wherever we went of young people – Israeli, American, European and Asian. The lessons to be learned were there before them. Whether school children, Birthright visitors or groups such as the youngsters with the Maccabbi games, it was gratifying to see them tour

and learn about the whys and wherefores of the State of Israel.

To you I say, "Next year in Jerusalem." May you visit and learn why it is that we are Jews and why Israel must survive.

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF AMERICAN JEWISH HISTORY

I'm in love with the building! If you haven't seen it already, I strongly suggest that you visit the National Museum of American Jewish History located prominently on

Independence Mall in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

From the vast expanse of glass which covers the front of the building to the state-of-the-art exhibits, this is an exceptional museum.

The core exhibition offers a layered experience covering more than 350 years of Jewish life in America. There are evocative objects, telling moments and interactive media. The exhibition highlights the diverse backgrounds, expectations and experiences of Jews who came to and made their homes in the United States. Visitors explore how and when Jews immigrated to America, the choices they faced, the challenges they confronted and the ways in which they shaped and, were shaped, by their American home.

Each of the four floors of the museum covers a different aspect. The fourth floor is titled "Foundations of Freedom: 1654 – 1880." This floor profiles the earliest Jewish communities and captures the flavor of everyday Jewish life in America from the Colonial days to the late 1880's. The third floor covers the years 1880 –1945, and is called, "Dreams of Freedom." It raises questions about what it meant to be a small minority in a young and still-evolving nation. It ends with the great migration of Jews from Europe to America. The second floor, 1945 until today is called, "Choices and Challenges of Freedom." The first floor, "Only in America," is the Hall of Fame.

As you walk thru the building, you do not know where to look first. The walls are covered with moving projections. There are auditoriums with continual showings about different topics. My one complaint is that there are not enough places to sit as you watch the many talking exhibits. There is even a t.v. studio, where you can make your own 'movie' about a choice of subjects and e-mail it home or to friends.

This museum definitely deserves a five star rating!
