ACE PROGRAMS AT LEISURE WORLD

JRLW will continue to co-sponsor the interesting and thought-provoking JCC Adult Center for Education (ACE) program this fall providing four new courses. The History of Civil Rights and Liberties; 50 years: The History of Israel, 1948-1998; Comparative Religion Series; and Theatre Workshop: "The Colors of Red: The Mendel Beiliss Defense." The classes will meet on Tuesdays starting October 1 and run through November 12, in Club House I from 9:45 am to 3:30 pm. There will be no classes on November 5. The cost for each course will be \$25.00 for members and Leisure World Residents and \$35.00 for Non-Residents. Registration will begin this month in Club House I.

Class Schedule:

The History of Civil Rights and Liberties – Instructor Paul Levy 9:45 – 10:45 am

Paul H. Levy is a retired history and social science teacher.

This course will review the history of selected Rights and Liberties stated or incorporated in our founding documents and Constitution. Among subjects included will be gun control, freedom of speech, and equality. Time will be spent on the 14th Amendment and an in-depth examination of the contributions of Thurgood Marshall and Martin Luther King, Jr. Each class will provide historical context followed by discussion of a related contemporary issue.

Comparative Religion Series 11:00 am – 12:00 pm

Religion affects the daily lives of its adherents, giving moral purpose and guidance for the conduct of many in society. This series is meant to educate, promote understanding and respect for different religious faiths in our community and reveal the commonalities in their differences.

Leaders from five different religions in the D.C. area will share their beliefs and practices, and hopefully help deepen appreciation of your own beliefs and practices and build respect for the traditions followed by others.

50 years: The History of Israel, 1948 to 1998 – Instructor Dr. Ira Weiss 12:45 – 2:15 pm

Dr. Weiss is a retired neurophysiologist and collector of cinema related to Jews and Israel.

Through rare dramatic documentary film collected by the Israel Broadcast Authority, supplemented by short lectures and discussion, we will examine the first fifty years of Jewish statehood. We will witness Israel's in-gathering of exiles, its wars, its efforts to make peace, wrestling with its national identity and its economic revolution from agriculture to high tech in only a few years.

Theatre Workshop: "The Colors of Red: The Mendel Beiliss Defense" – Instructor Howard Eisner 2:15 – 3:30 pm

Howard Eisner, DS, is a retired electrical engineer, research professor, author and businessman.

"Beiliss Accused of Ritual Murder...Kiev. 1913." Mendel Beiliss, a Russian Jew, stands accused of murdering a Christian child in order to use his blood for the Passover Seder. After two years of imprisonment, Beiliss will finally have his trial. The world watches with "horror and disbelief." waiting, wondering whether Beiliss will be convicted. Area playwright Howard Eisner has dramatized the true story of Mendel Beiliss' defense in bold, compelling strokes. Class participants will bring this new, suspenseful drama to life and explore the trial.

What's Cooking in the Kitchen?

Kasha Knishes

Ingredients:

2 ½- cups sifted flour

2- eggs

1/2- teaspoon salt

2- tablespoons water

2/3- cup salad oil

1- teaspoon baking powder

Directions:

Sift flour, baking powder and salt into a bowl. Mix dry ingredients well. In the center of the mixture, drop the eggs, oil and water. Work into flour mixture with your hands and knead until smooth. Chill dough while preparing fillings. Divide dough in half and roll as thin as possible. Brush with oil. Spread filling on one half of the dough, and roll up like a jelly roll. Cut into 1½ inch slices. Place on oiled baking sheet, cut side down. Press down and lightly flatten. Bake in 375° oven about 45 minutes. If frozen after baking, reheat in 375 degree oven for 15 minutes.

Kasha Filling:

1- cup medium kasha, uncooked

1- large onion, finely chopped

2-3 -Tablespoons of chicken fat salt and pepper to taste

2-3- cups chicken broth or water

1-egg, optional

Directions:

Saute onions in fat until golden, and set aside. Heat kasha in a saucepan over medium heat until browned. Add any combination of liquids. Cook for about 15 minutes, until kasha is soft but not dry. Add more liquid if needed. Stir in sauteed onions. Season to taste.

The 6th Annual National Falls Prevention Awareness Day will be observed on Sept. 22, 2013. This year's theme is *Preventing Falls - One Step at a Time*.

In a recent article Alan M. Jette, PT, PhD, the Director of the Health and Disability Research Institute at Boston University says, "The term 'fear of falling' (FOF) describes an exaggerated concern of falling that frequently leads to a self-imposed restriction in activities. The fearful older person narrows her world, often resulting in social isolation and a spiraling physical, emotional, and functional decline until even simple acts like taking a bath or walking to the mailbox are insurmountable."

Dr. Jette denoted the World Health Organization's reference in 2007 when he said, "Support from family, friends and professionals can mitigate this fear and can act as a buffer against the potential debilitating effects of FOF. People who rely on friends and talk about their fears were least likely to report activity curtailment (Howland et al, 1998). This support may encourage the older person to remain active despite fears and seek help when needed."




